## TEAM NOTES

Under 6A: The boys have been rather busy since the last report and have taken part in two "knock-out" competitions as well as playing their normal competition games. The second game ("B" div.) resulted in a Nil all draw but our boys were eliminated when a re-count of "corner kicks" was taken. The boys may have failed to win a game against the older teams but they certainly won the respect and admiration of all spectators (especially all parents). Well done boys - a really "gutsy" display. The following Sunday the team contested the under 6 "Round Robin" at Toukley and although they tried hard they could not quite find the form of the previous week. After getting off to a good start with a Nil all draw with Budgewoi A and 2-0 victory against Terrigal, they were then defeated 1-0 in a close match by Wyong (eventual winners). Having lost any chance of making the semi finals the boys just strolled through their last game against Woy Woy to record a Nil all draw. Steven Cottle scored both of the "Tiger" goals and his fine solo effort from half way for his second goal was to be commended. The last five competition games have resulted in Wyoming defeating Berkley Vale 8-0, Kanwal 3-0, Toukley 2-0 twice and Wyong 2-1. The competition is completed and as the Premiership is decided on a "first past the post" basis, the boys have had to settle for 2nd place. Only 2 points separated the two top teams (Budgewoi & Wyoming) with Budgewoi taking the honours by virtue of their first round 1-0 win against us. The winning goal was scored with only 10 seconds remaining in the match and our boys were extremely unlucky to have missed a scoring opportunity about 20 seconds earlier.
