LAW AMENDMENTS FOR THE 1979 SEASON

effective from 1st January, 1979.

The international board, at its meeting on 1st June 1978, decided to make certain alterations to the Laws of the Game.

Law 11 - OFFSIDE - has been re-written as detailed below:-

1. A player is in an off-side position if he is nearer to his opponents' goal-line than the ball, unless:-
 - (a) he is in his own half of the field of play or
 - (b) there are at least two of his opponents nearer their own goal-line than he is.
2. A player shall only be declared offside and penalised for being in an offside position, if, at the moment the ball touches, or is played by, one of his team, he is, in the opinion of the referee
 - (a) interfering with play or with an opponent, or
 - (b) seeking to gain an advantage by being in that position.
3. A player shall not be declared offside by the referee
 - (a) merely because of his being in an offside position or
 - (b) if he receives the ball, direct, from a goal-kick, a corner-kick, a throw-in, or when it has been dropped by the referee.
4. If a player is declared offside, the referee shall award an indirect free-kick, which shall be taken by a player of the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred, unless the offence is committed by a player in his opponents' goal-area, in which case, the free-kick shall be taken from a point anywhere within that half of the goal area in which the offence occurred.

The improvement brought about by the new wording clarifies the situation in that a player remains off-side when the ball is played by a member of his own team even if the ball strikes an opponent in flight. The only factors determining whether a player is given offside are whether or not he is in an offside position at the moment the ball is touched or played by a member of his own team AND is seeking to gain an advantage or interfering with play or an opponent. The fact that the ball later strikes an opponent does not negate the original offside.


We are still a few coaches short for some teams, and should anyone feel that they can fill these vacancies please contact me on 62 1176.
