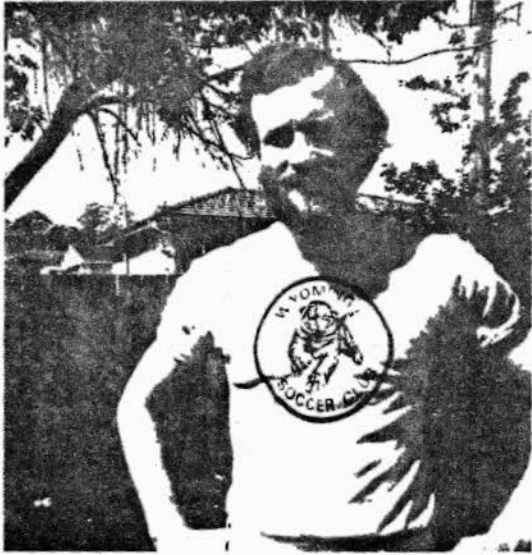
We held our Annual General Meeting and dinner at the Central Coast Leagues Club on Friday 14th September, 1979 and a lovely night was had by all.

This report will be the 10th annual report made by the club which was admitted to the Central Coast Soccer Assoc. on 18/3/70.

Many players, coaches, managers and committee have passed through the club in those 10 years and there has been some outstanding achievements - but 1979 has been the most successful, the biggest and the best run.

This year the club has grown to a record 23 teams (20 junior, 3 senior) a total of over 300 players and every indication it will be even bigger next year. The club has become the biggest on the Central Coast.

Due to this growth the club needs an able willing and energetic committee. The committee aims are to keep, as far as possible, the responsibility and duties to a minimum still providing the necessary community service. The best way to achieve this, we have found, is to spread the work load out, not to involve the club in non beneficial activities during the season. We realise only too well that every committeeman/woman has a home life which is his/her major involvement.

This years committee has been one of the best I have worked with and consequently has helped the club function with the minimum of fuss.

Committeemen have attended meetings regularly as well as the coaches and managers, who we ask to attend one meeting a month to help us keep them informed of club activities.

Kevin played for seventeen years with the Hurlstone Park Soccer Club, to which he was made a Life Member of that Club. In 1969 he was captain of N.S.W. U/21 Amateur State Team.

Kevin joined Wyoming Soccer Club in 1975. His first game for the Club

was against Budgewoi but he got lost somewhere along the way, Budgewoi won 9-nil, however Wyoming went on and won the Senior title that year and Kevin was made "Player of the Year" for the Wyoming Soccer Club in the 1975 season.

1979 would have to be among his greatest achievements in his soccer career. He was re-elected as President of Wyoming Soccer Club. He was appointed Captain-Coach of the Central Coast Representative team, which won the Northern N.S.W. State Championship for the fifth year running. He was one of the instigators in forming the steering committee for a Central Coast team to enter the State or Philips League Competition. His marriage to Leonie had the best wishes from everyone involved in soccer on the Central Coast. He scored the winning goal in this years Grand Final against Wyong, which brings his tally of Premierships to thirteen from the past sixteen years, four out of five with the Wyoming Soccer Club. Under the guidance of Kevin and his fellow management committee the Wyoming Soccer Club this year has won for the first time the Sterland Trophy presented to the top Junior Club on the Central Coast. (Previously won by East Gosford for the past twelve years).

Kevin plays the game hard and clean, he has never been sent off (sometimes wheeled off!!!). His dedication and involvement in Junior and Senior soccer was rewarded at the Club's A.G.M. when he was made a Life Member of Wyoming Soccer Club. 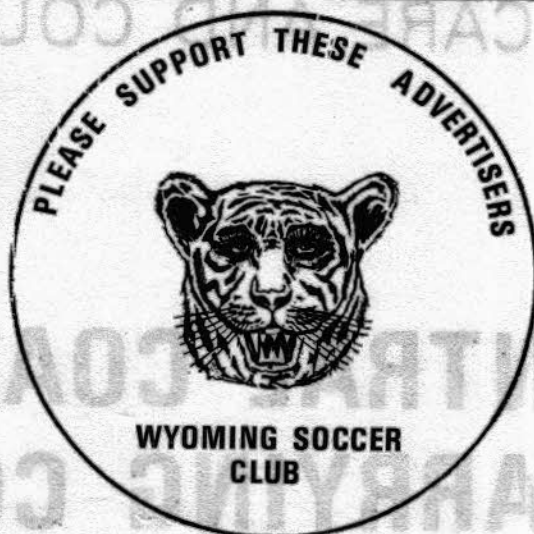


