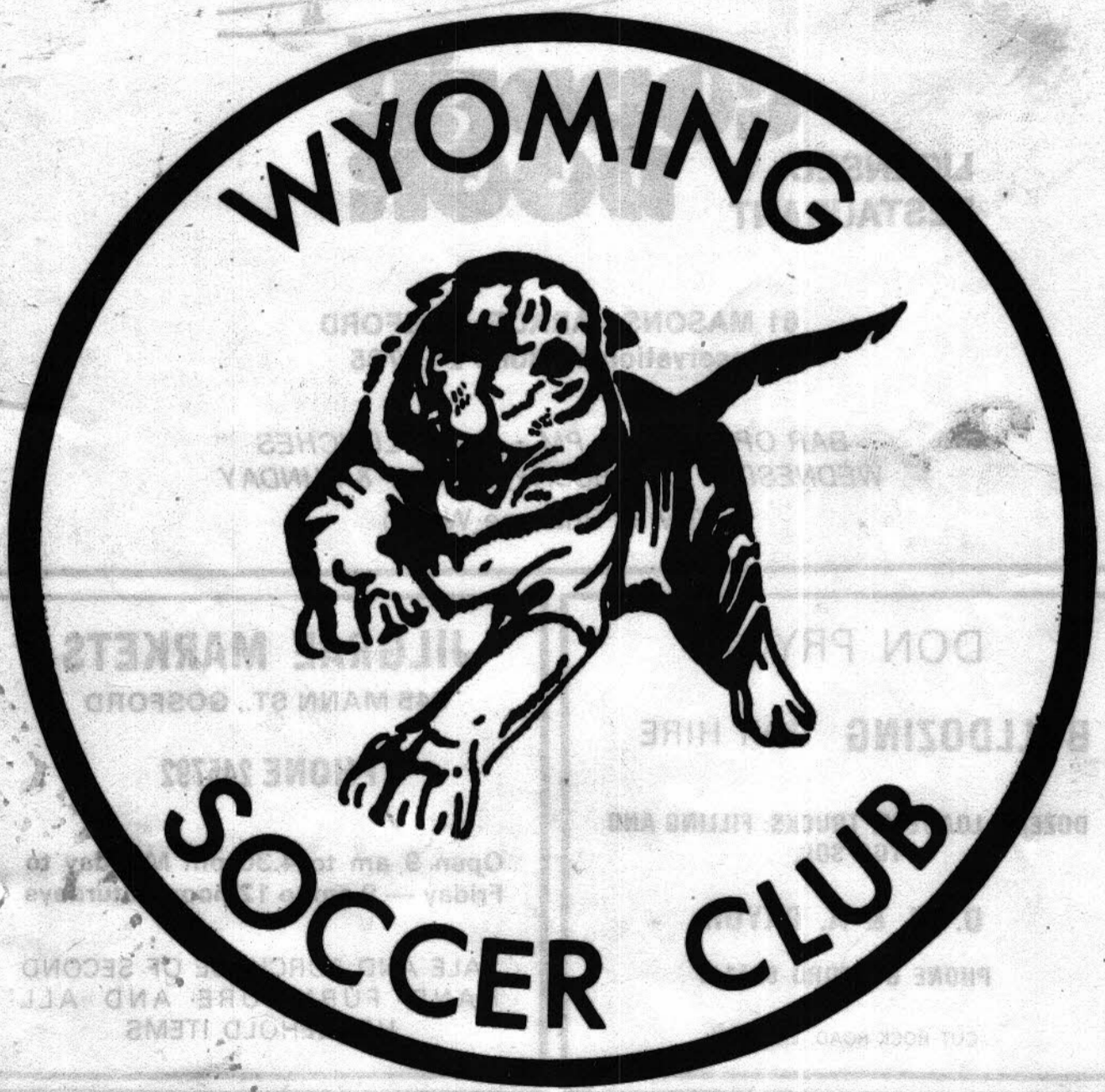
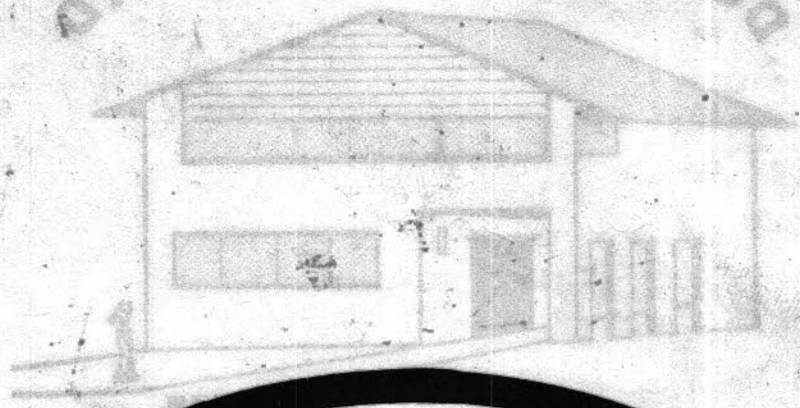

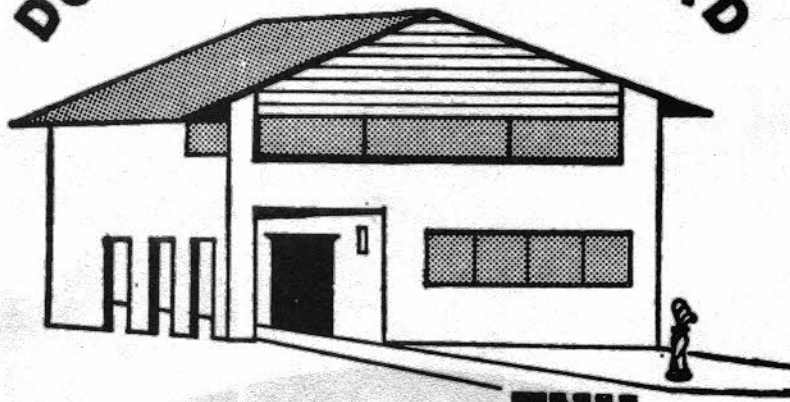

OFF-SIDE

- 1) A player is in an off-side position if he is nearer to his opponents' goal-line than the ball, unless:
 - (a) he is in his own half of the field of play, or
 - (b) there are at least two of his opponents nearer their own goal-line than he is.
- 2) A player shall only be declared off-side and penalized for being in an off-side position, if, at the moment the ball touches, or is played by, one of his team, he is, in the opinion of the Referee
 - (a) interfering with play or with an opponent, or
 - (b) seeking to gain an advantage by being in that position.
- 3) A player shall not be declared off-side by the Referee
 - (a) merely because of his being in an off-side position, or
 - (b) if he receives the ball, direct, from a goal-kick, a corner-kick, a throw-in, or when it has been dropped by the Referee.
- 4) If a player is declared off-side, the Referee shall award an indirect free-kick, which shall be taken by a player of the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred, unless the offence is committed by a player in his opponents' goal area, in which case, the free-kick shall be taken from a point anywhere within that half of the goal area in which the offence occurred.

INTERNATIONAL BOARD DECISIONS

1. Off-side shall not be judged at the moment the player in question receives the ball, but at the moment when the ball is passed to him by one of his own side. A player who is not in an off-side position when one of his colleagues passes the ball to him or takes a free-kick, does not therefore become off-side if he goes forward during the flight of the ball.

HOW TO IMPROVE YOUR SOCCER

First I would like to start off by talking about a very important part of your soccer gear and that is your soccer boots.

Coaches have sent players to me, because they cannot kick the ball properly and find, that a player, whose action at kicking is perfect still cannot kick straight or have control of the height of the ball. We then look at the boots and discover that they are too big. This is wrong not only can a player fail to kick straight or lift the ball, he also runs a great risk of severely hurting his toes or ankles and in some cases it has been known for players to break bones in their feet, particularly when playing in wet weather and the ball becomes heavy.

To avoid possible injuries to the feet buy a pair of boots that will last only one season at a reasonable price. Don't be fooled and spend a high price for boots because they look good or have screw-in studs and getting a size bigger, with the hope of getting two seasons out of them. Boots should fit neatly around the foot with about a quarter of an inch from the end of your toe, to the toe-cap of the boot. Laces should be threaded over and over (not criss cross X) so that if you injure your foot the coach or first aid officer can cut your laces without further damage or pain to the injured foot.

When tying the laces make sure that the knot is tied outside of the foot. This enables you to kick the ball without interference from the knot.

To become a good player requires more from you than just turning up to your team practice nights. It is important to practice at least twenty minutes a day off the field, in the back yard for instance, practice kicking the ball against a brick wall (mind the windows!!) using the inside and outside of the foot, changing from the right to the left foot starting ten feet from the wall, increasing the distance as you improve. Remember, while doing this also practice your trapping with the chest, thighs and feet.

COACHES MEETING

Recently the club conducted a COACHES meeting and introduced JOHN GIBSON & IAN RUSHTON. These two men will act as CLUB COACHES and are available to all teams for advice and guidance.

At the meeting there was a demonstration of FIRST AID with particular attention paid to "BLOW UP SPLINTS" which are now available in the FIRST AID BOX in the KIOSK.

All coaches present were handed a section of Australia Soccer Federation coaching manual which specifies the standard of attainment a player should possess at a given age.

It is of utmost importance a coach realises his aims in coaching and understands the fundamentals of the game his boys should possess.

It was also decided that the 433 system be the BASE system which all teams will be taught. A separate manual should be available soon for coaches perusal. Each coach may use his players to the best of their ability and there may be need to vary from the 433.

The above mentioned Manuals have the complete support of the club as do both CLUB COACHES. To standardise our coaching methods so that we head in the same direction each coach is asked to support.

TEAM REPORTS

Under 6A: No report to hand.

Under 6B: After four games so far this season the team remains undefeated having scored 12 goals and only conceded one.
