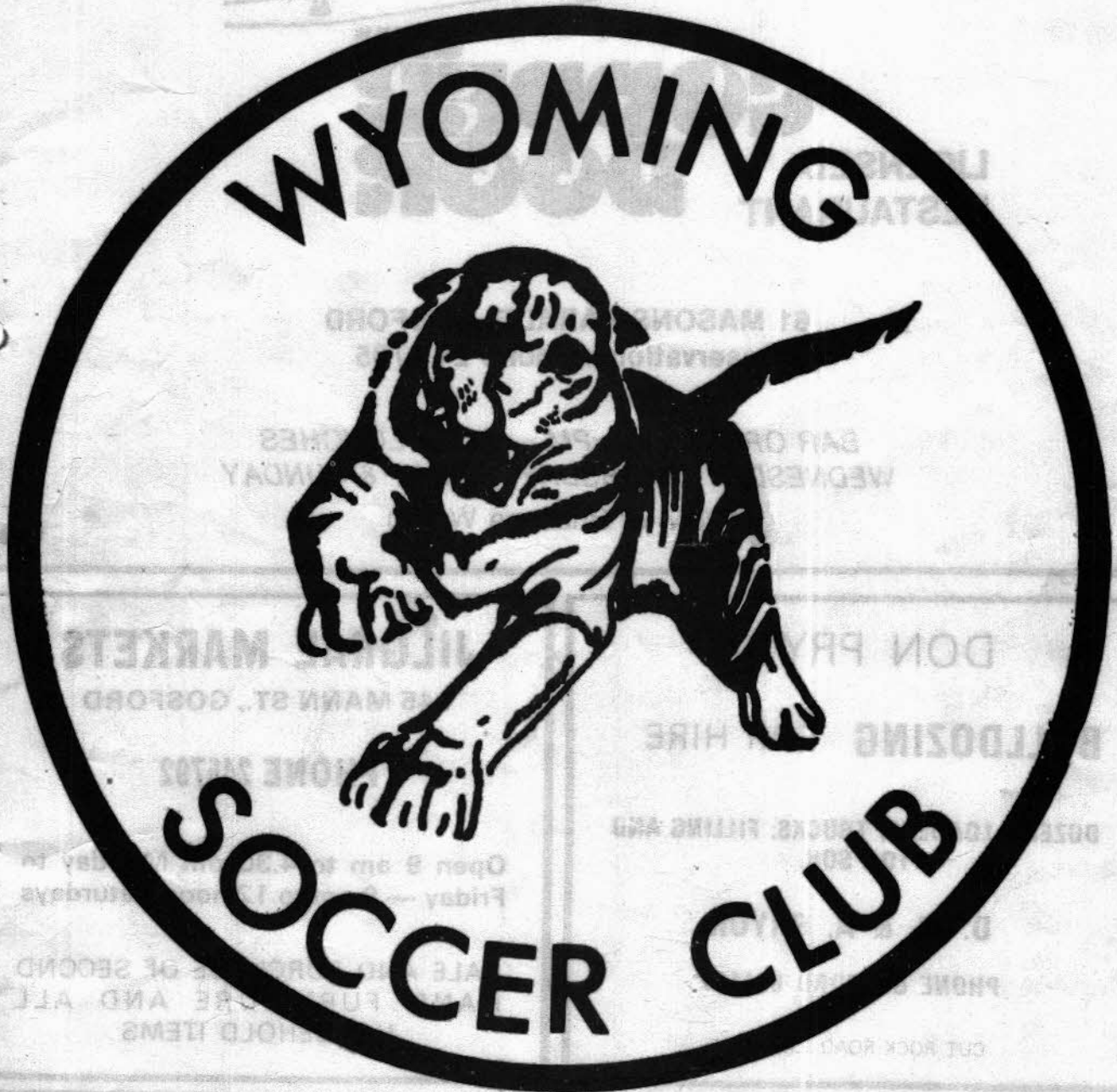

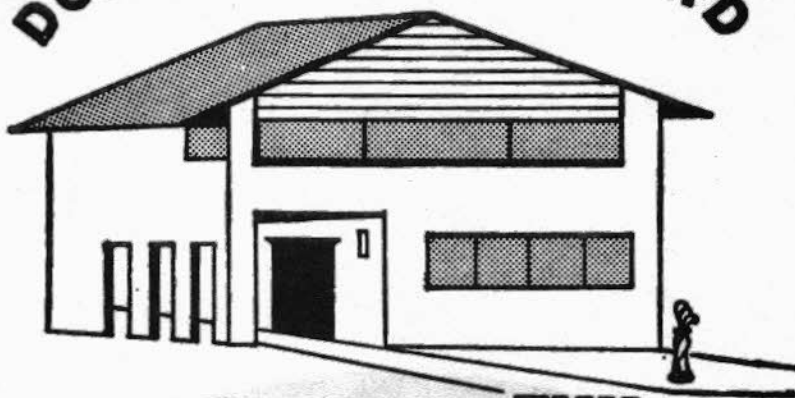

There are a lot of boys in the club who are still unable to head or kick a ball correctly. The inability to head or kick a ball correctly in the younger age groups is to be expected, as they are just starting in their careers as soccer players. However, in the older age groups it is not expected unless a player has just taken up the sport of soccer.


Some people tend to blame coaches of the older groups for the inability of players to master these skills. Don't blame the coaches. Blame the boys for not practicing at home in their spare time. I have seen coaches instruct players on these two skills and weeks later there is still no improvement. Perhaps you have not been listening to your coaches instructions on how to master these two skills.

It is very difficult for your coach to give you personal basic skill training, when the rest of your team is at an advance stage. If you feel you require personal training, don't be afraid to ask your coach to be excused for part of your training session to come and see me or Mr. John Gibson. This is part of our jobs as club coaches. I am sure coaches would only be too pleased to help you in any way they can.

Every one knows that, when heading a ball, the ball must bounce off the forehead. However, some boys do forget that the eyes must watch the ball at all times. If you find that the ball is hitting you on top of your head, this is due to you taking your eyes off the ball and ducking your head down. So remember, keep your eyes on the ball at all times. If you do this correctly, the ball will not hit your nose or any part of your face. Practice this at home with a tennis ball and if you are still having problems, do come and see me or my co-partner.

The inability of some boys to kick a ball correctly can be due to one or more mistakes:-

- 1) Improper angle of approach to the ball.
- 2) Improper placement of the non-kicking foot.
- 3) Improper body position.
- 4) Improper position of the kicking foot after the ball has been kicked.

To find the correct angle of approach to the ball takes practice. Problems of this nature can be easily corrected by your coach. When running to kick the ball, the non-kicking foot must end up along side of the ball thus . If the foot is too far forward, you will not kick the ball correctly. If the foot is too far back, you will end up with a toe-punt. The body must be positioned over the ball, head down, eyes on the ball. The kicking foot then kicks the ball with the ball hitting the lower laces of your boot. Once the ball is kicked the body leans back and the kicking foot follows through, finishing above waist height. Practice this at home and if you are still having problems, don't be afraid to ask for help.

INTERNATIONAL BOARD DECISIONS

INFECTIOUS HEPATITIS

Hepatitis is in the area, and it was felt that parents should be warned of this.

The infection is considered to be transmitted, especially in sport, from HAND TO MOUTH. Please warn your children against sharing food and drinks and impress on them the importance of washing hands after using the toilet and before eating meals.

Symptoms are described in the World Health Commission Pamphlet:-
Infectious Hepatitis (viral hepatitis type A) usual incubation period, i.e; time between infection and illness about 25 days.

SYMPTON & SIGNS - Onset is usually sudden, with fever, loss of appetite & nausea. Tiredness and aches in back and limbs can also occur. The patient experiences nausea and vomiting, a tenderness over the liver and jaundice (yellowing of the skin). Urine becomes dark. The skin may be itchy. In milder cases jaundice may not occur.

Frank O'Toole has played his best football this year lately and it is an interesting fact that these two players come from Sydney's Wests Inter Suburban team.

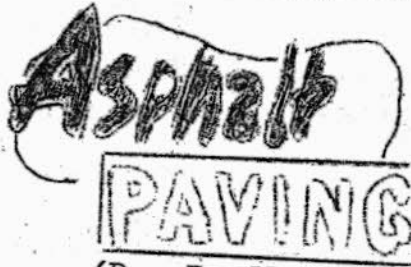
Other players who have had good games lately are Ken Butt who has given the supporters something to cheer about with his clever ball work.
