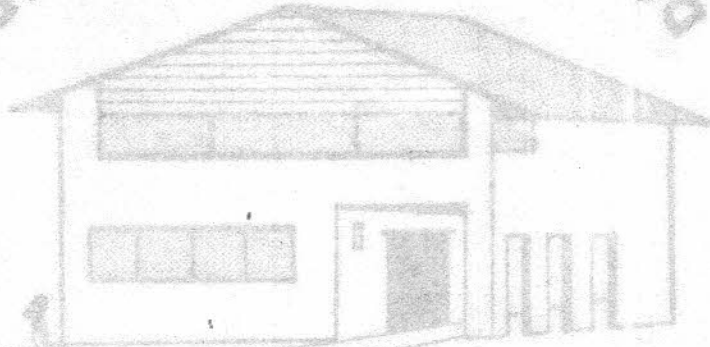

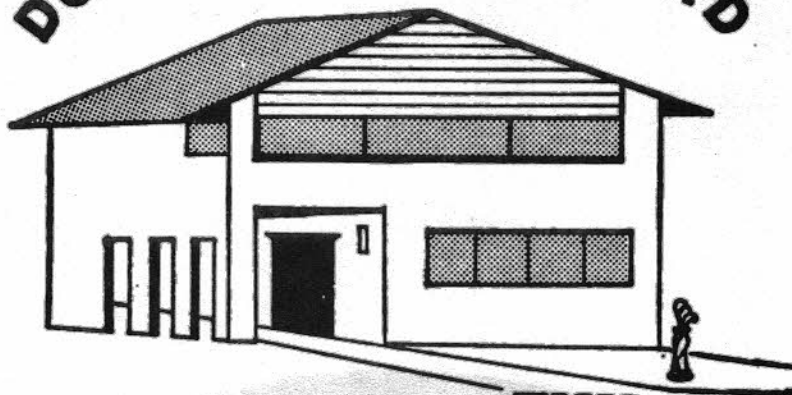

Dear Parents & Players:

This Saturday sees the start of the second round of the competition. At this stage Wyoming are the leaders in the Sterland Trophy and are on 205 points with Umina next on 190, and East Gosford on 141. We are also leaders of the Senior Championship which is made up of the Reserve grade and 1st grade teams. We are on 99 points with Wyong close behind on 93 points, so it will be interesting to see if we can keep the lead in these point scores.

We have been very fortunate to be given a computer sheet for every team with details of all games played in the first round. These will be given to all coaches and should you disagree with any score etc. please advise me immediately so that it be corrected. I am sure all of you who see this sheet will realise the work that has gone into the preparation of this sheet and this can only be done if we get all the scores in on time. Referee sheets must be handed in as well too.

Arrangements can be made with me if any teams would like team photos. These would be done by one of the players fathers and will therefore be cheaper than last year.

If any parents use any of the Sponsors let them know that they are using them because of the advertisement in the Bulletin. For example one of the parents used Central Coast Carrying to move them because of the advertisement on the back page.

This is the first bulletin that has a report from every Junior team, so coaches and managers keep up the good work and let us hope for the same every edition.

All in all it promises to be a good night so organise your baby sitters now and don't forget tickets must be purchased before the night for catering reasons.

"Thank you" to Gerry ten Heggelar, Jeff Cassar and John Launt for the new pegs for the ground.

It has been brought to the committee's notice that some coaches are overloading their cars on the way to matches. In the Norman Ross Player of the Year Award, Jim Bryden Wyoming's striker is in 3rd place, 4 points behind the leader and 1 point behind second place.

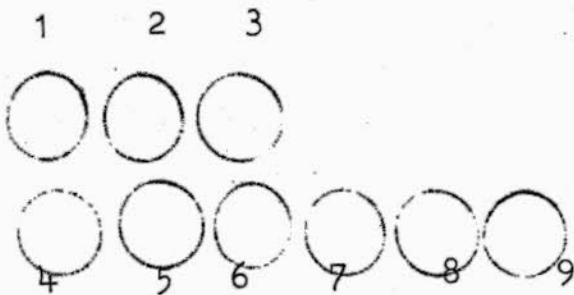

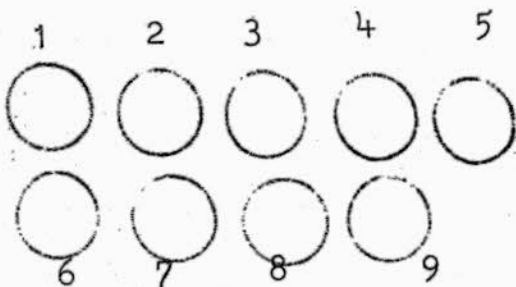

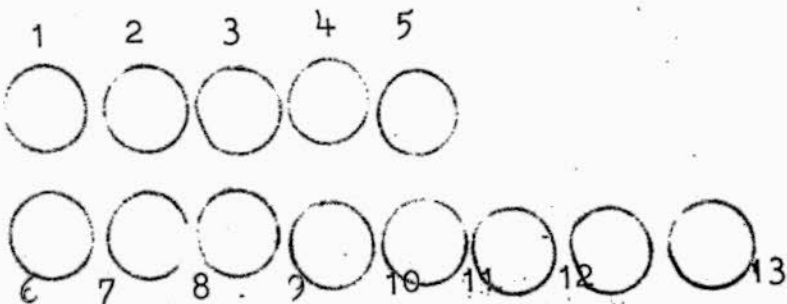
