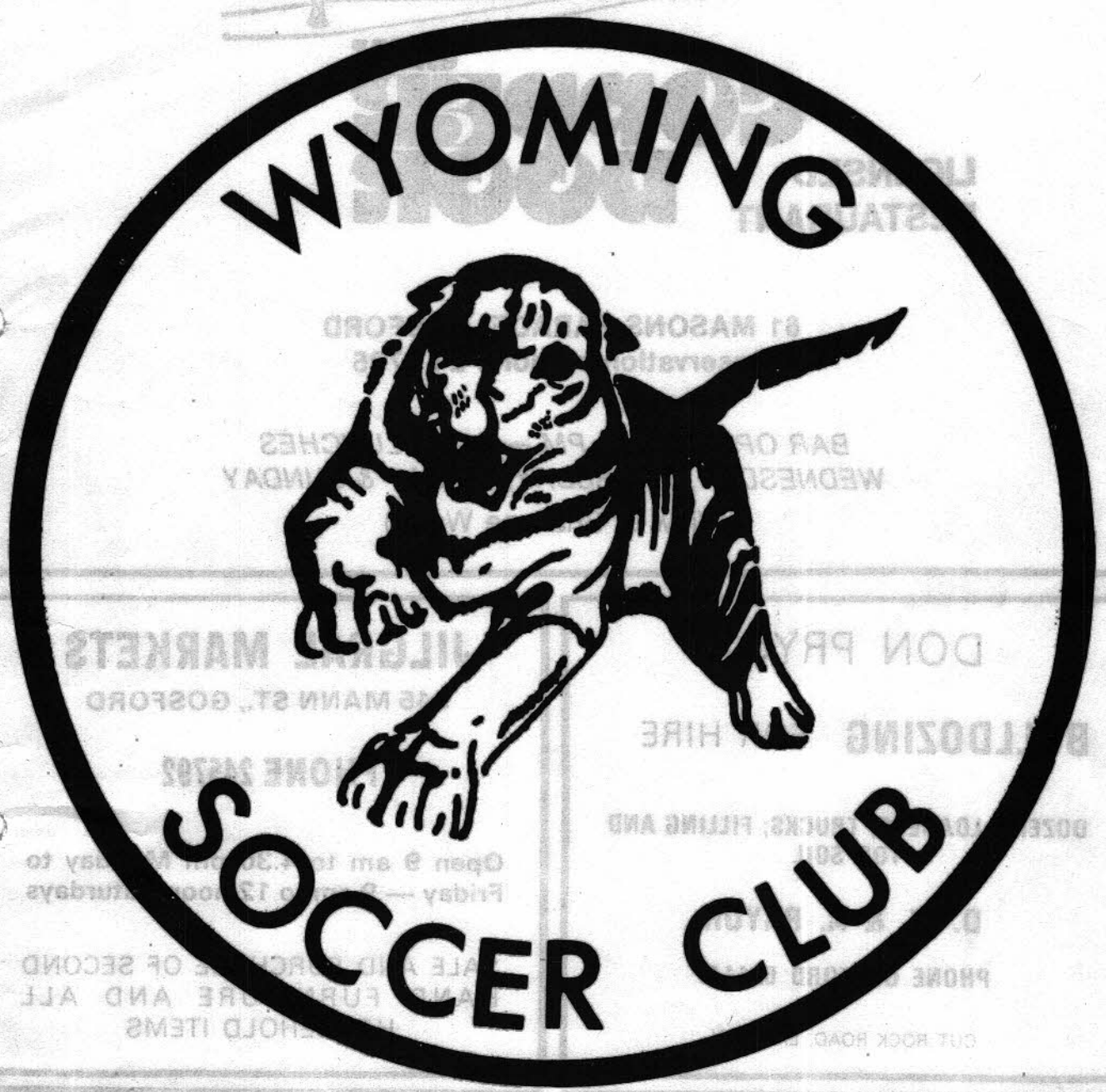
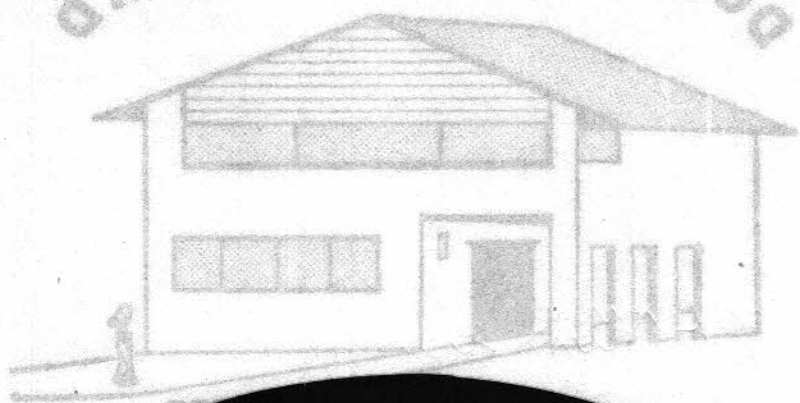

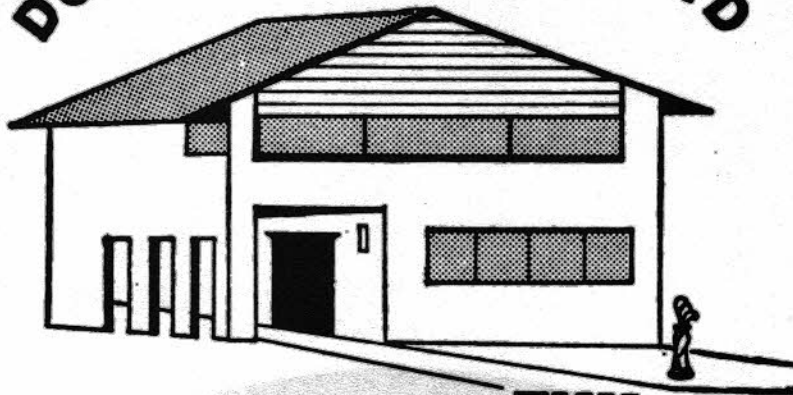

TEAM REPORTS

Under 6A: 5.7.80. Wyoming 0 v Killarney 2. Under 6B: Since the last bulletin our results have been 2-0 wins over Berkley Vale, 2-0 win over Killarney District, 1-0 win over Woy Woy and a 1-0 loss to Umina 11, only our second loss of the season. All the boys have maintained the high standard they set earlier in the season but special mention should be given to the two most improved players over the last month, Bernard Howes and Zachary Malsem. We have so far scored 21 goals and conceded only three. Danny Bembrick is still top scorer with 18 goals of the 21 goals but it is pleasing to see Michael Liubinskas becoming a regular scorer lately. David Maryska, the smallest player in the team, continues to amaze with dribbling runs the full length of the field, dazzling the opposition with sheer speed.Coach....

Under 7A: 28/6/80. Wyoming 0 v Entrance 2. The win was the main factor in the loss of the game. The Entrance handled it a lot better than our boys did. 5.7.80. Wyoming 0 v Killarney 0. A good game from both sides with neither team having too many chances. A fair result.Manager...

Under 8A1: 28.6.80. Wyoming 4 v Entrance 0. A very ordinary sort of game, played in almost impossible conditions with the blustery winds dictating play. The boys, however did control the ball a lot better than the opposition and once again it was their team work and passing that made the difference and kept their unbeaten record at the end of the first round. 5.7.80. Wyoming 3 v Killarney 0. Another good win with the boys scoring their goals in the first half. Although attacking continuously in the 2nd half they were unable to increase this lead, due mainly to some solid defence from Killarney. PROPOSED CONSTITUTION AMENDMENTS

1. PROPOSAL

a) Insert new clause 6 (i) (e)

"Any person for the time being appointed as a coach by the club".

b) Clause 6 (i) (b)

delete "parent / guardian".

insert in lieu "parent, guardian or spouse.

REASON

a) A coach who is not a parent of a registered player should not be required to pay an annual subscription to become a member of the club.

b) A spouse of a registered player should have the same rights as the parent/guardian of a registered player.

If adopted the new clause will read:

A member of the Club shall be:

(a) any registered financial player of the Club.

(b) any parent/guardian or spouse of a registered financial player of the Club up to and including under 18 year olds.

(c) any other person who pays an annual subscription determined by Annual General Meeting each year.

(d) any life member of the Club.

(e) any person for the time being appointed as a coach by the Club.

2. PROPOSAL

Clause 6 (ii)

delete ".....Executive Committee"
insert in lieu "..... General Meeting".

REASON

The constitution sub-committee feels that an appeal against suspension or exclusion would be more meaningful if made to a body not connected with the original decision to suspend or exclude. Under the existing constitution the only right of appeal is to the Executive Committee whose members, being also members of the Management Committee have already judged the issue.

If adopted the new clause will read:

(ii) Suspension or Exclusion of a Member.

If any member by his conduct or by his associations shall be in the opinion of the Management Committee undesirable as a member or if the Management shall consider that any member should be excluded permanently or temporarily from the club or from the use of its property or from any part of its activities that the Management Committee shall have the power to suspend the membership of such member permanently or temporarily provided that the member shall have the right to appeal to a General Meeting whose decision shall be final on such appeal.

3. PROPOSAL

a) Clause 7 (i)

delete "..... Senior delegates (2) one other committeeman".

insert in lieu "..... Senior delegate, minute secretary, other committeemen (2)".

b) Clause 7 (i)

delete "twelve (12)".

insert "thirteen (13)".

c) Clause 7 (vi)

Insert new sub clause

Minute Secretary : Responsible to record and keep in order minutes of all meetings".

d) Clause 7 (i)

delete "four (4)".

insert in lieu "five (5)".

e) Clause 7 (i)

add "Minute Secretary".

REASON

Under the present constitution the seniors control 1 of the votes on the Management Committee with the two senior delegates.6 The constitution sub-committee feels that this is disproportionate and, while recognising the need for a senior delegate, feels that the Management Committee and through it the club, would be better served by the election of a general committeeman who may or may not have any connection with the senior teams.

For example when the last vacancy for a senior delegate arose at least one member did not stand for election as he had no senior connections. We wish to make it clear that persons connected with the seniors should still be able to stand for any office but that one delegate elected specifically because of his/her connection with the senior teams should be sufficient.

In addition the duties of the secretary have become so extensive that it is felt the appointment of a minute secretary is justified.

If adopted the new clause will be:

Members of the Management Committee of the club to number thirteen (13) comprising President, Vice President, Secretary, Minute Secretary, Treasurer, Social Secretary, Registrar, Publicity Officer, Ladies Auxiliary (2), senior delegate, other committeemen (2).

In the event of one officer taking more than one position the number of committeemen will increase to compensate.

Members of the Executive Committee to number five (5) comprising :
President, Vice President, Secretary, Minute Secretary, Treasurer.

In addition the "Duties of Management Committee" would include;

Minute Secretary : Responsible to record and keep in order the minutes of all meetings.

4. PROPOSAL

Clause 7 (iii) (a)

delete "..... the club".
insert in lieu "..... it".

REASON

We are unable to understand why the original club constitution which gave the Executive Committee the right to determine any appointments made by it was changed to include any appointments made by the club. Under the present constitution this clause conflicts with clauses 6 (ii) and 7 (ii).

If adopted the new clause would read:

"The Executive shall have the right to determine any appointment made by it or to suspend the appointees and such determination or suspension shall be effective when notified to the person affected.

5. PROPOSAL

Clauses 7 (v) (f)
7 (iv)(b)
7 (iv)(c) deleted in their entirety

The sub-committee feels that sponsorship, being the prime revenue earner of the club, should be administrated by the management committee which, by the Constitution, is charged with the responsibility of "The control and management of the Club.....". We feel that a wider cross section of views on this issue can only be to the benefit of the club and the potential of this issue to create divisions within the club, as has been evident in 1980, would be eliminated if it was kept open,

If adopted these alterations will mean that sponsorship will become the responsibility of the Management Committee.

6. PROPOSAL

Clause 7 (v) b

add "..... and its members".

REASON

Suggested merely to clarify what is otherwise left open to interpretation to some extent and for the sake of conformity with Clause 7 (v) (d).

If adopted the new clause will read:

(b) To acquire by purchase, exchange or as gifts, donations or property of any kind, which in the opinion of the Management Committee may be necessary or useful for the benefit of the club and its members.

7. PROPOSAL

Clause 7 (vi)

add to the duties of Secretary "..... Responsible to maintain and up-date a list of the by-laws of the Club for issue to all appointees and, on request, to any member.

REASON

Numerous problems have arisen in 1980 because various appointees, coaches in particular, do not know what is required of them by the club and, if the club's requirements are listed as by-laws they will carry more weight than suggestions in the bulletin, word of mouth etc.

8. PROPOSAL

new clause 8 (iii) a

"All contested elections for office shall be decided by secret ballot".

REASON

Self explanatory. Election by secret ballot is a fundamental principle of a democratic system.

9. PROPOSAL

Clause 8 (vii)

add "Members shall have the right to attend Management Committee meetings but shall not have the right to speak unless invited by the Management Committee, or to vote.

REASON

Again, the right to witness the decision making process should be a fundamental democratic right of all members. If we can attend Parliament as an observer surely we can do the same within our club.

10. PROPOSAL

Clause 9 (iii)

add after "shall think fit " " and shall be available for inspection by any member of the Management Committee or, at the discretion of the Management Committee, by any member of the club".

REASON

The original club constitution provided that members of the Management Committee could inspect the books of account. We are at a loss to understand why this sentence was deleted from the current constitution. As the Management Committee is charged with the responsibility of administering the club and specifically its funds as outlined in Clause 7 (v) it must have access to the appropriate records.

If adopted the new clause will read:

(iii) Inspections of Books of Accounts etc.

The accounts, books, documents, vouchers and records of the club, shall be kept at the club's premises or at such other place or places as the Management Committee shall think fit and shall be available for inspection by any member of the Management Committee or, at the discretion of the Management Committee, any member of the club. The accounts shall be presented and passed for payment at a monthly General Meeting and the minutes of such approval shall be included in the minute books.
