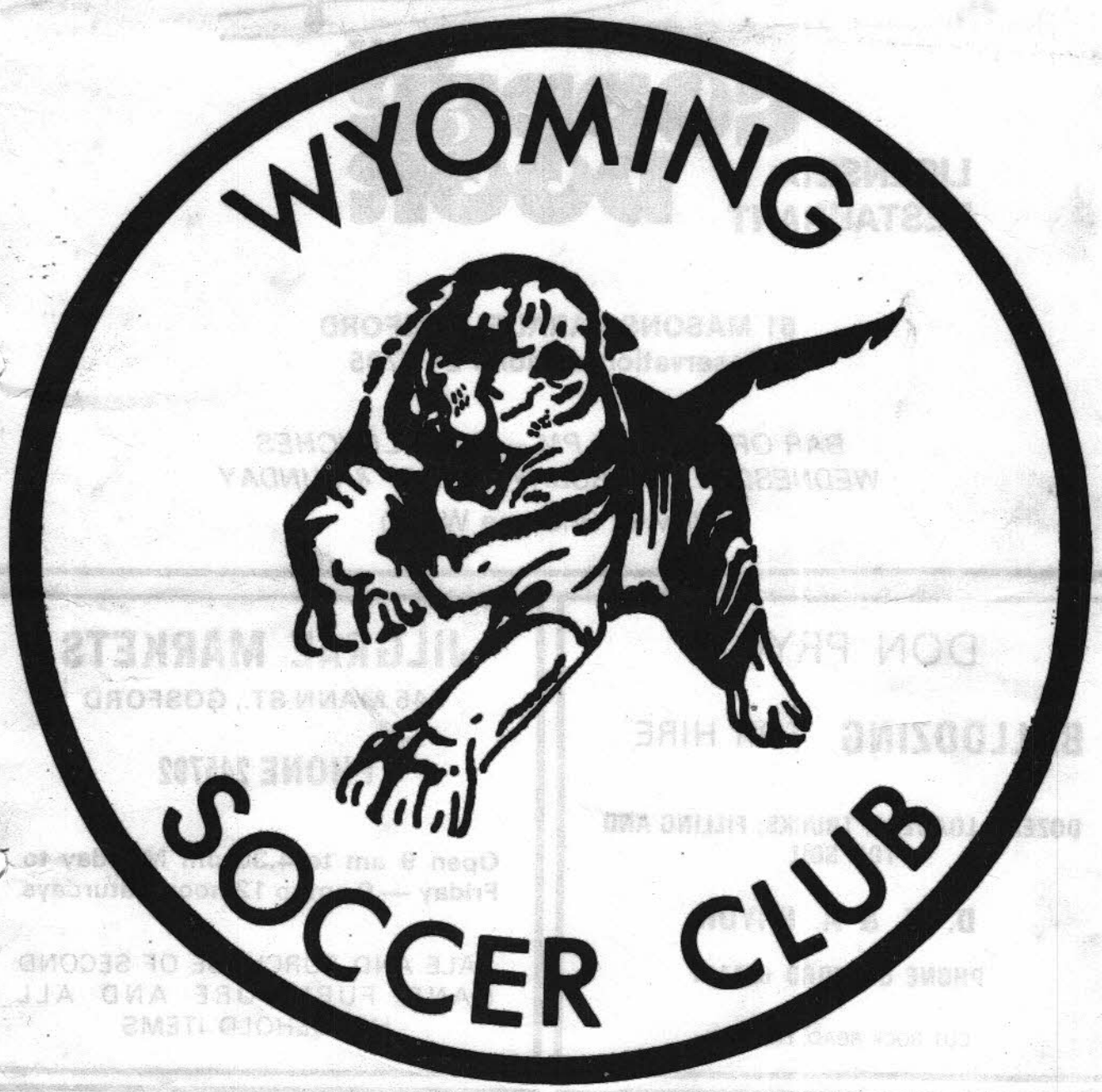

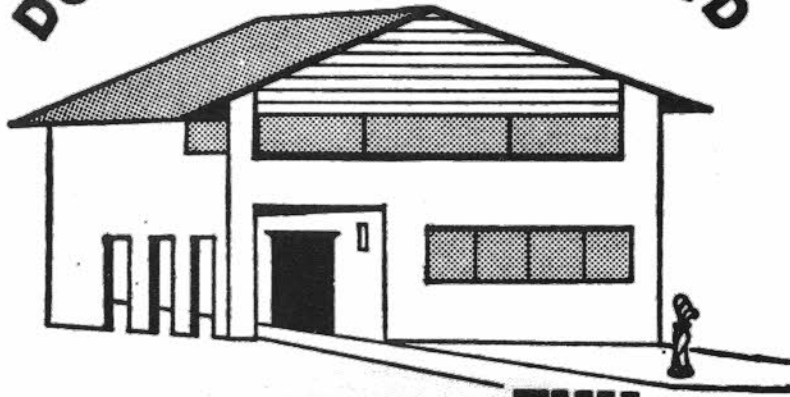

Dear Parents & Players:

It is hard to believe that we are getting into semi final time again. A MESSAGE FROM COACH OF COACHES

Very few players are able to master the skill of turning with the ball. This is a skill that all forwards should master, particularly when a player has his back to the goal and he needs to turn and shoot for goal without losing possession of the ball.

When a right footed player receives the ball, the ball is received by the right foot, the right foot cushions the ball as if to trap it but instead of trapping the ball, the foot and ball continues past the swiveling left leg, the body turning to face the opposite direction, the body weight is then transferred to the right foot with the left foot trapping the ball so as possession is maintained, the skill is performed in one easy motion.

Practice this at home by kicking the ball at a wall and when receiving it turn and kick the ball at a target.
