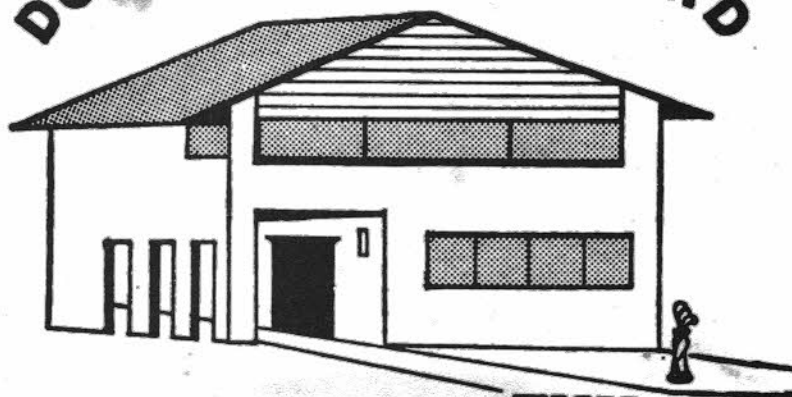

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT

The Junior Club Championship (Sterland Trophy) and the Senior Club Championship are ours for the 1980 season - it's the ultimate in soccer supremacy on the Central Coast - a distinction never before achieved by one club - we are the championship club and the club has you to thank - its your year - everyone's victory no matter where your team finished in its competition, it all helped. Congratulations you should be proud to be associated with the PREMIER CLUB 1980.

Coming down to earth, it really has been a successful year for the club with eleven (11) teams making the semi finals (9A,9B,9C1,10A,10B,10C,12A,13A, senior 1st, Reserves and 2nd div.) and one team outright undefeated premiers (8A being first past the post the post) and another (7B) being very successful in a non-competition grade.

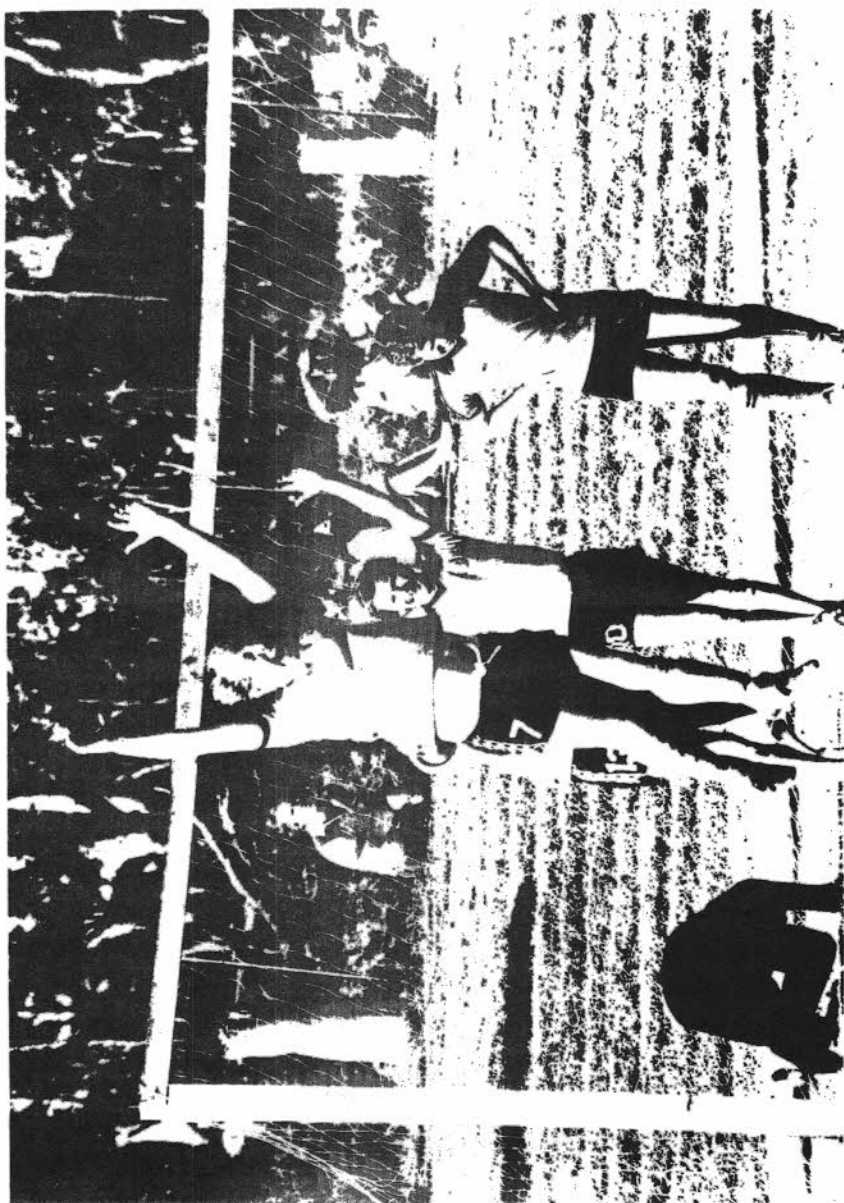

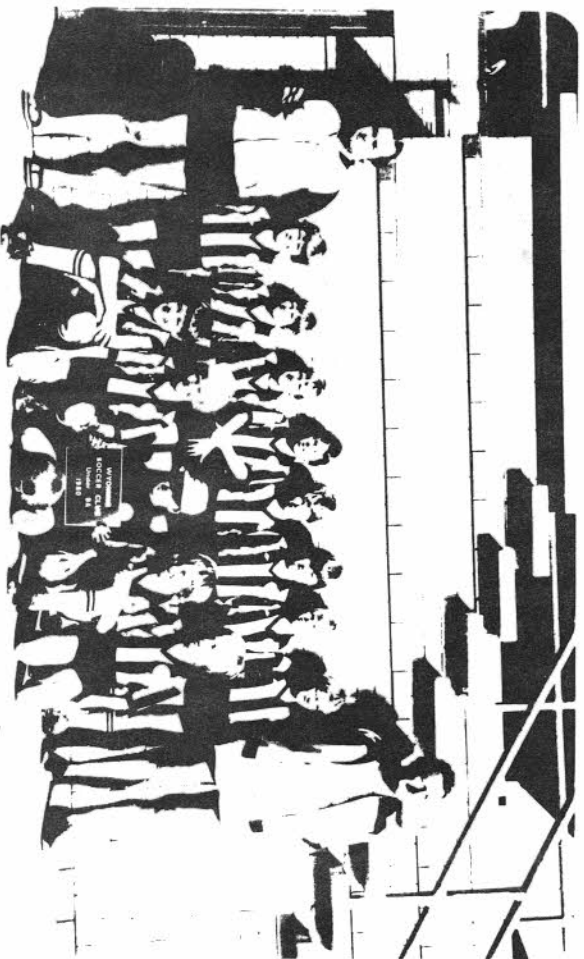

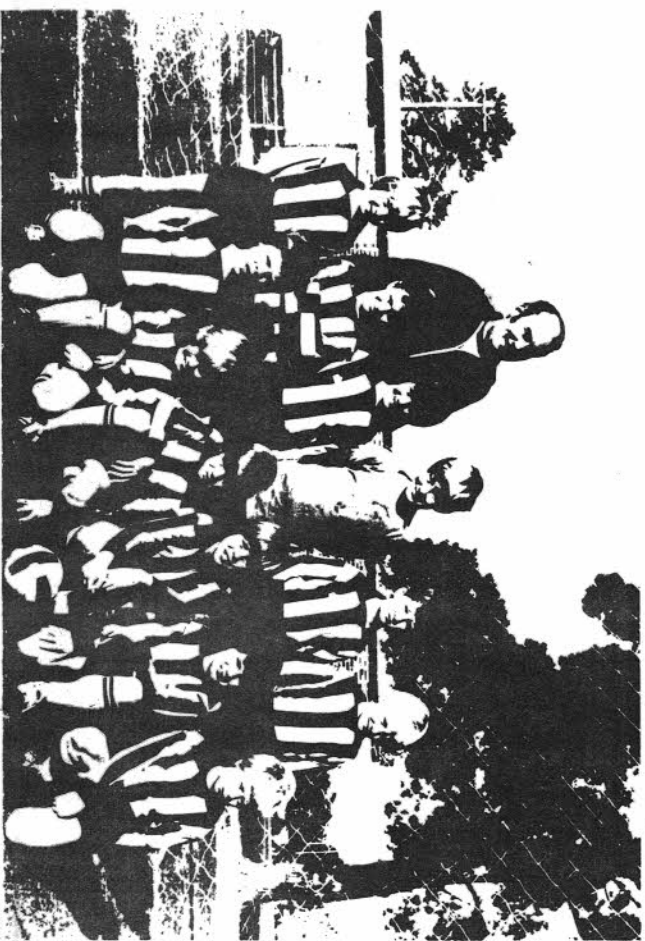
