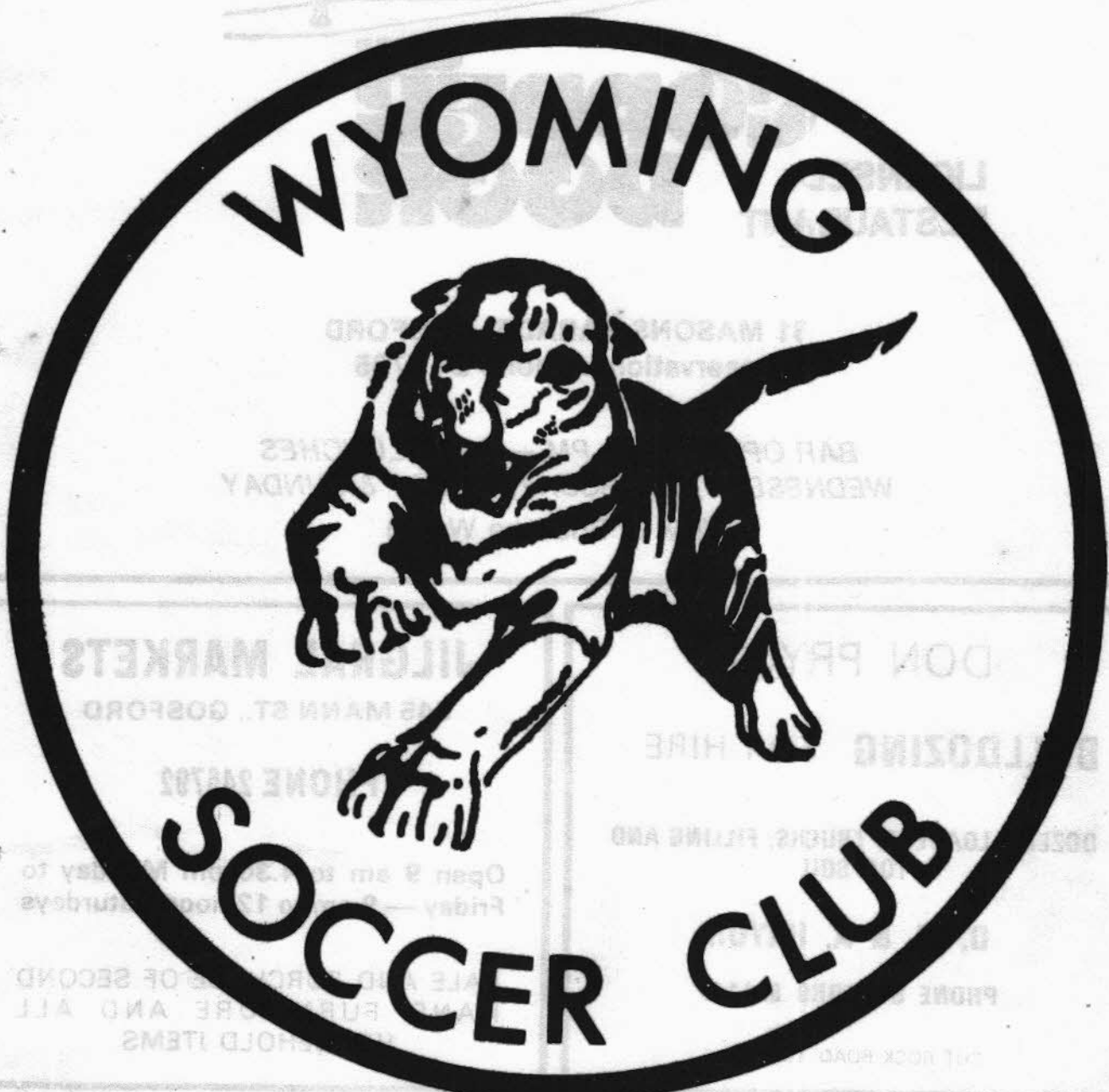

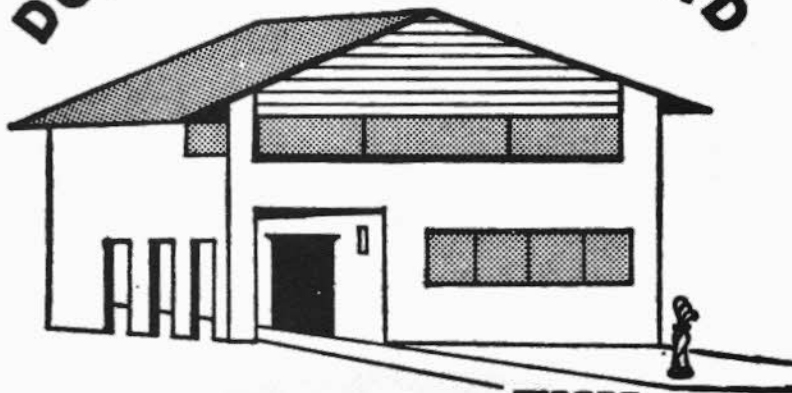

Our Club Coach, Ian Rushton is always available to help any team. He is down at the oval a great deal and should you miss him there you could contact me and I will see him for you.

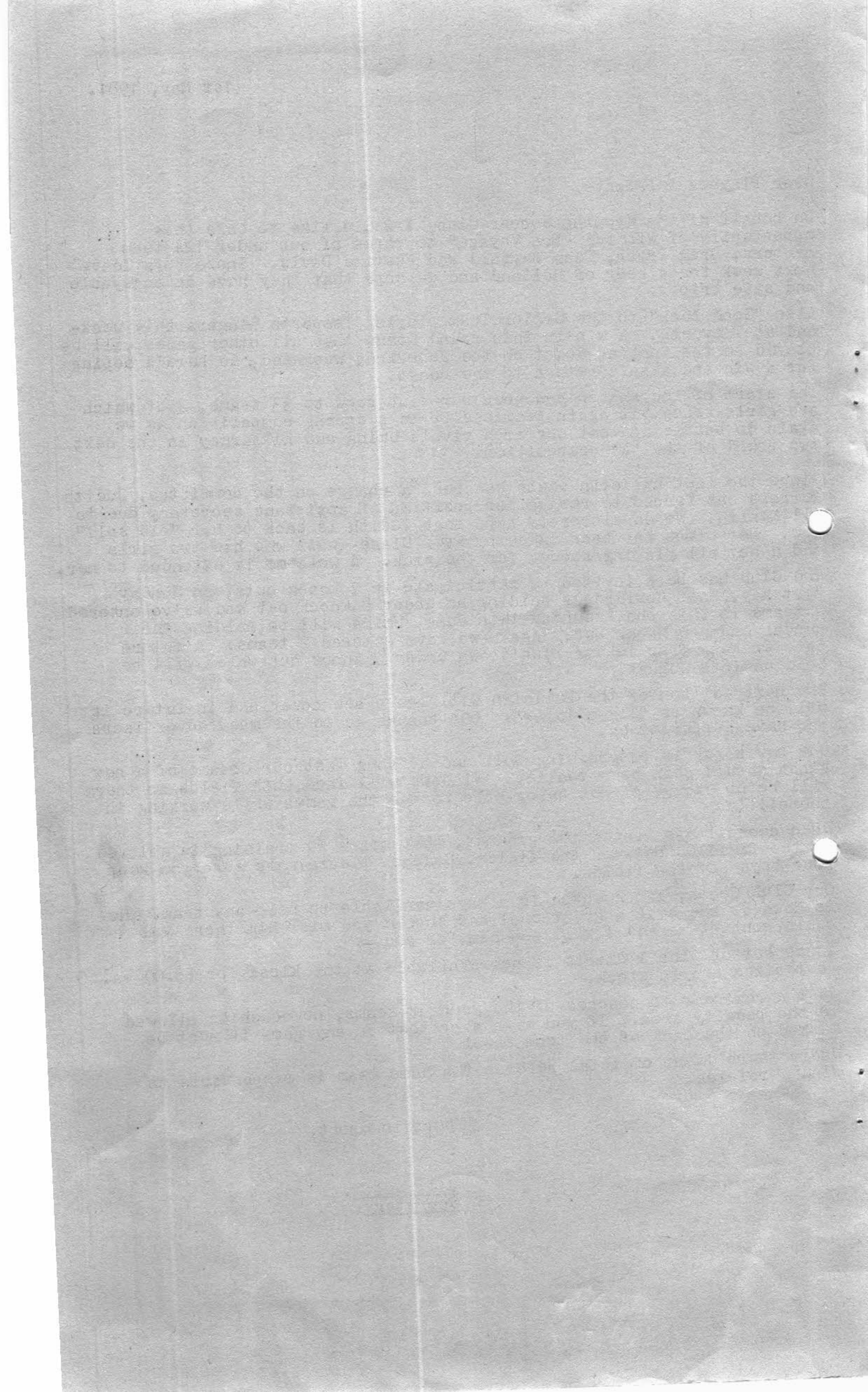
A new lot of Club T/Shirts is now available at the kiosk for \$5.00 ea. Most sizes are in stock.

Under 9C2: The opening game of the season against Woy Woy represented the first competition soccer game for a number of the boys. The 0-0 scoreline was a fair indication of the play with both teams unable to finish off promising build ups. Under 11A: With the 1981 soccer season well under way and three matches completed, I am happy to report that the team has notched up 2 wins and 1 draw. Our first match against The Entrance was a little disappointing although we won 21 nil. The Entrance could only field 7 players and the game proved to be of little value to either team. UNIT 11A - PRESIDENTS CORNER

The season has started and it appears already that the club is heading for another good year.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all coaches and players the very best for the coming games.

I would also like to remind coaches and managers of club requirements:

1. It is not desirable for the coach to be the spouse of the manager.
2. Care must be taken with club equipment eg; balls and shirts.
3. Shirts must be collected from players after each game and washed by a responsible person.
4. Registration cards must be taken to each game and you must have one for each player - every card must be signed by the player.
5. Make enquiries before the game whether there is a referee and if so prepare referee's sheet - do not sign it until after game - confirm correct score.
6. If home game, tear off bottom of referees sheet and place in KIOSK BOX.
7. Only pay the referee if he is "official".
8. If no referee, come to agreement with opposition coach - the kiosk will stock spare referee sheets and whistles - please return whistle to KIOSK and referee sheet to KIOSK BOX.
9. Always carry your own whistle - for games away.
10. Referees fees are recoupable at club monthly meeting (4th Monday each month at C.C.Leagues Club) (non recoupable after 2 months)
11. Make enquiries before day whether you are first home game on field you are required to prepare ground ie; net, flag posts, line markings.
12. If you are last home game, you are required to pack up.
13. Half time oranges are available in kiosk before games, whether home or away.
14. Do not overload your car with players it may affect your insurance.
15. Make every endeavour to ensure all players have adequate transport.
16. First aid equipment is available in kiosk.
17. Your co-operation is necessary to stop harassment of referees and control of spectators.
18. Players in your team required by a higher age group can not play more than two divisions lower eg; 10A cannot play 11C but can play 11A, 11B.
19. Players cannot play in same age group team or lower age group.
20. Match result slips and 3-2-1 awards are to be placed in KIOSK BOX same day and results to be included on result chalk board at front of kiosk.
21. Coach and/or Manager are required at Club monthly meetings.
22. Monthly team reports (200 words) are required at monthly meetings for inclusion in BULLETIN (TIGER TALES)
23. Parent and your participation are required in kiosk serving.
24. Parent and your participation are required for Grange Chook raffles Friday night 5-6 (see roster)
25. If unavailable find a replacement coach for training.

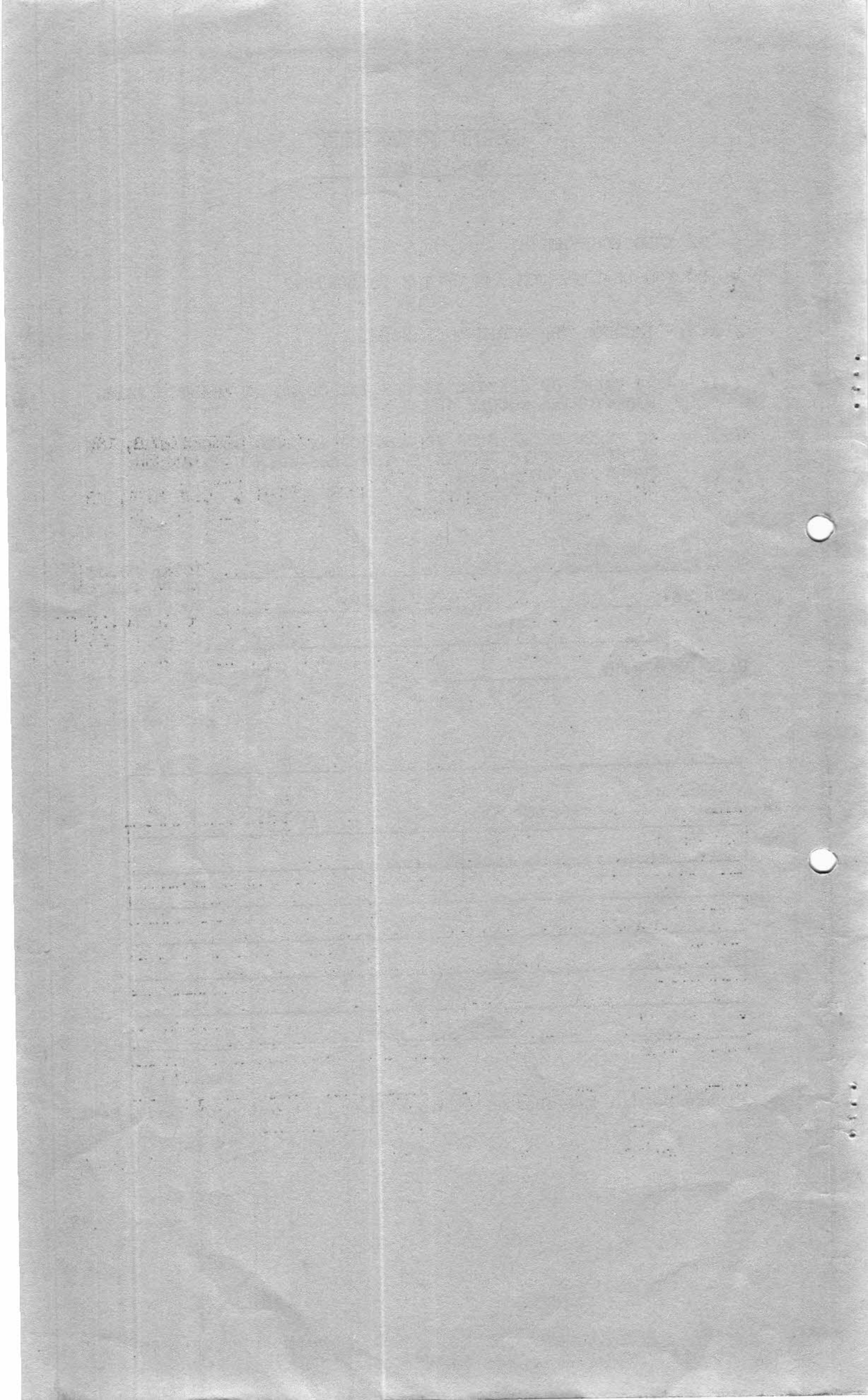
