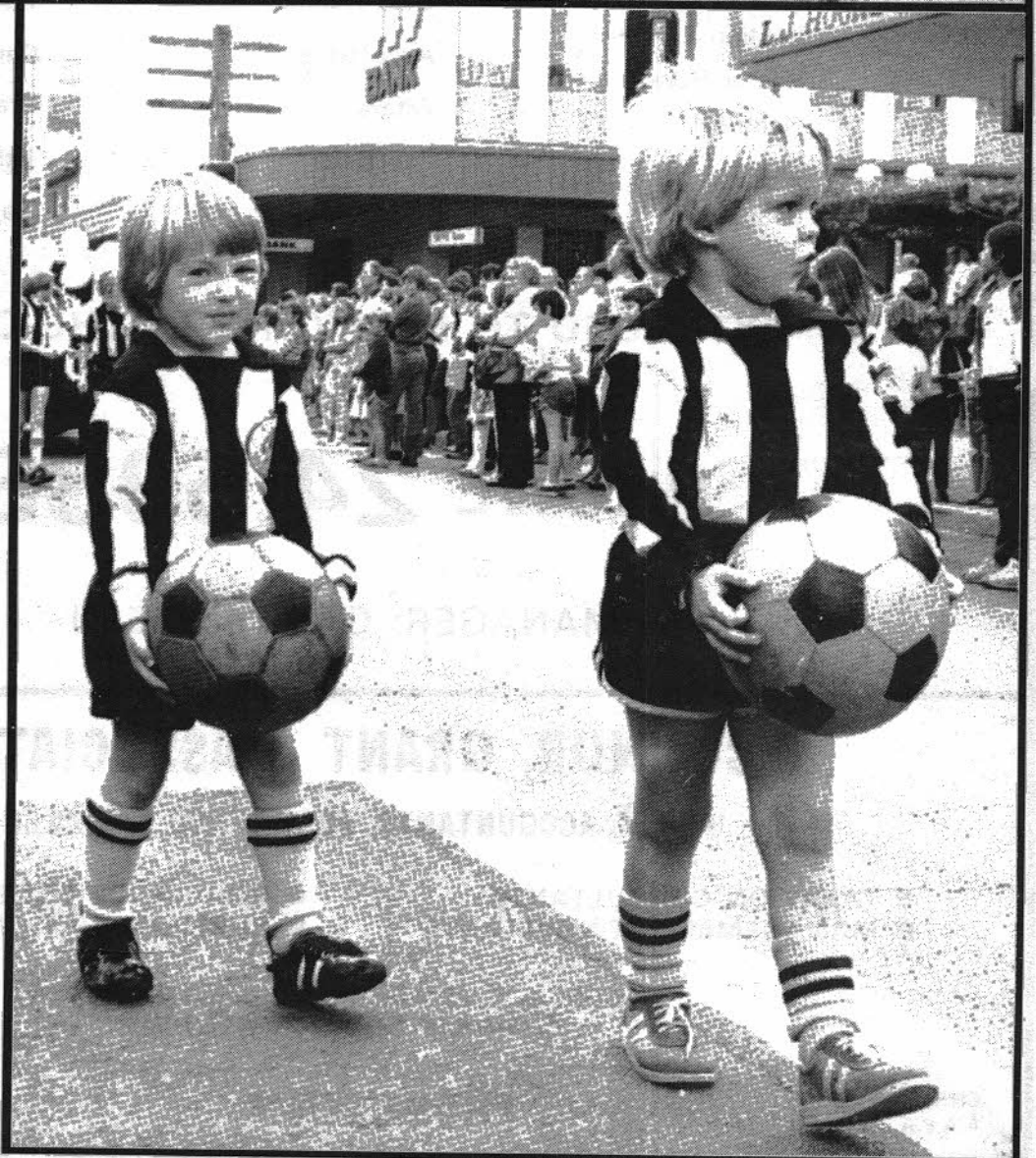

TEAM REPORTS

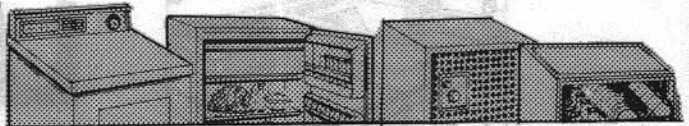

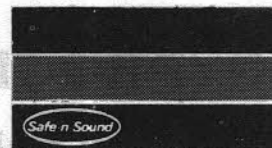

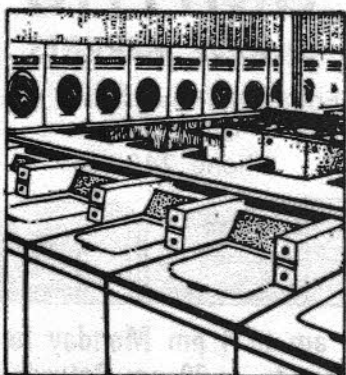
