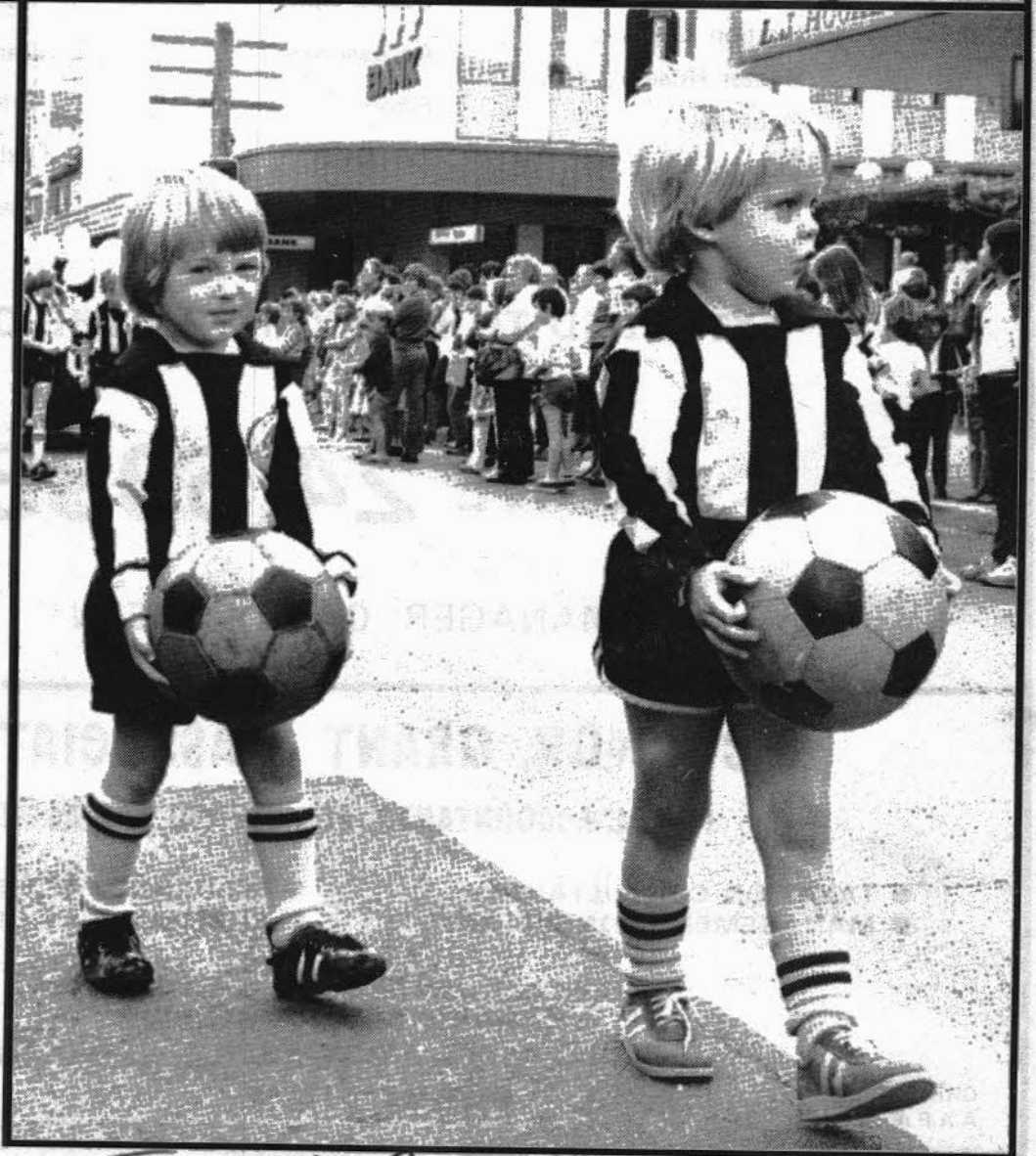

TEAM REPORTS

Under 6A: June: The U6A team so far this season has an extremely good defensive record. They have suffered only two defeats, both early in the season, but have found it extremely difficult to put the ball into the back of the net. It must be noted that the competition in the 6A's is very stiff, and all the games are very close affairs with our boys almost always having the best of play without being able to capitalise on their advantage. Although the forwards play well in the open they consistently fail to finish off their attacks. Players like STEVEN COMBER and BRENDEN NAPIER have shown the ability needed to score goals but their final kicks somehow always seem to hit or graze the posts. KIRK MERCER and RYAN COLLINS have added strength to the mid field, both boys are willing to tackle and chase the ball for the whole game. The back line defenders of the team, DAVID CLARKSON, SIMON NASH, DANIEL TURPIN and LIKE MASON provide a solid base for the team. They are strong, consistent defenders and are the force behind the team's good defensive record. Simon has good basic skills combined with a strong kick, and Luke is a strong tackler who reads a game perfectly for a boy his age. GRANT BAILEY has made some good saves in goal despite being the smallest and youngest player on the field each week. All 15 boys in the team have improved greatly from the start of the season and they have had great support from their parents. Both parents and boys are enjoying their soccer and that means that everyone wins each Saturday, no matter what the score. July. The team continues its **great** defensive record with only one loss so far this round. The boys have only been beaten by two sides this whole season, Umina and Gosford, and in this second round only Gosford has been able to repeat its victory against us in the first round. We met Umina first and our team played splendidly. All the boys put in a first class effort and after fine lead-up work by STEVEN COMBER, ZACH MALSEM scored a good goal to have our team leading 1 nil at half time. DANIEL TURPIN, our goalie for the first half made some great saves and showed that he is just as good a player in goals as he is in the field. Soon after the start of the second half Umina scored their equalizer and it seemed that the reserves brought on at half time (due to the large number of boys in the team) hadn't had time to settle into the game and Umina took full advantage. Although we had to settle for a draw and had lost our chance to register a win against the strong Umina team. It must be said that all the players put in a tremendous effort and it was great to see all the boys playing as a team. No one player could be singled out as everyone of the boys played his best game so far this season. The very next week the boys played the only other team who has won against us. Contrasting with the first round this time the boys determined to make a real game of it. At the half time break the score was dead-locked at 0-0 and it seemed that the first team to make a mistake would lose the game. Our goalie for this game was Ryan Collins and he managed to stop some very strong shots from the Gosford forwards. Late in the second half the Gosford forwards got the chance they wanted and scored a good goal against us, and that was the final score Gosford 1, Wyoming 0. Although beaten we were not disgraced and the team is showing that despite all the team chances that are made each week they are gaining an understanding of all the positions on the field and this is adding to their skills as soccer players. The two other games this month against Budgewoi and Terrigal have ended in 0-0 draws, with our team having many chances, on both occasions, to score but failing to do so. ROBBIE ROSS has consistently played well in the forwards, trying for the whole match and making some long solo runs from well within our own half. BRET JAGER has of late made a dramatic improvement in his play with strong tackles and non-stop effort becoming his trade mark. Likewise GLEN SAWYER, ANDREW MCGILVRAY and DALE COLLINS are trying harder each week and enjoying their soccer because of it. you're a defender. 2. Defenders MUST NOT DISPLAY THEIR DRIBBLING SKILLS
in front of own goal - you must clear the ball away at once! 3. All
boys need to TACKLE more actively and not hang back. 4. All boys when
throwing in, MUST keep their feet flat on the ground. 5. Attackers are
wasting their effort by kicking the ball too FAR AHEAD, and losing it
in front of the other teams goal. Keep the ball under control. 6.
Players taking goal kicks should kick up the side, not up the middle...
at least until each boy can kick a high ball!!! Over the past three
weeks the team has not found it's earlier form. This probably due to
several factors viz: - Each boy is becoming a skilful player...and is
more keen on showing this, than on being a member of a team. - After
13 games the first novelty has worn off. - Having won 7 early games,
all boys are now "taking it easy". Wrong thinking they can keep winning

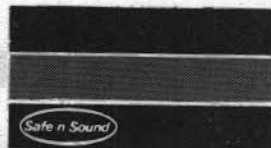

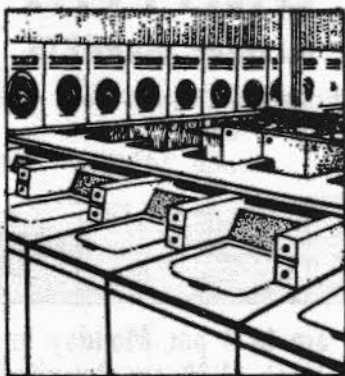
