## SENIOR REPORT

So ends another year of soccer and so ends the heart stoppers which have mushroomed this - no need to worry - its an easy game. Yes the crowd pleasers as they call themselves have finally succumbed to youth but not without the cliff-hanger impact they have so coolly developed.

Try as they might in their 7th Grand Final in as many years, the 1st grade, although they proved to the coast that they are the better side relinquished the Crown to the gutsy Umina.

It is Umina's first year for winning the trophy and a proud moment for their club. It would however, have been Wyomings 4th consecutive victory which probably would not have been good for the code on the coast - it would only give other clubs another reason to tackle us that little bit harder.

Reserve grade in all their regularity ploughed their way through the competition to another grand final only to find themselves left with a 3/0 deficit just after half time - but not be undone this team reponded - the spectators wanted it - East Gosford knew it was expected but hoped it would never start - but it did and the ball kept rolling and in went the goals - 3/3 full time, extra time 3/3 after second lot of extra time - Joint Premiers - never has one come from so far behind to break even - a truly magnificent effort from the players.

So the club has survived, maybe a little bitter taste in the mouth (probably Resh's Pilsner) but knowing that the two top teams were unlucky in their final games.

Next year will probably see new faces - old ones retiring - but the game lives on - the club grows with experience - it will only be a matter of a few years when our juniors start rolling through the senior ranks and that when the pensioners can hang their boots up in pride - because it will be them that have layed the foundation for the younger generation to uphold.
