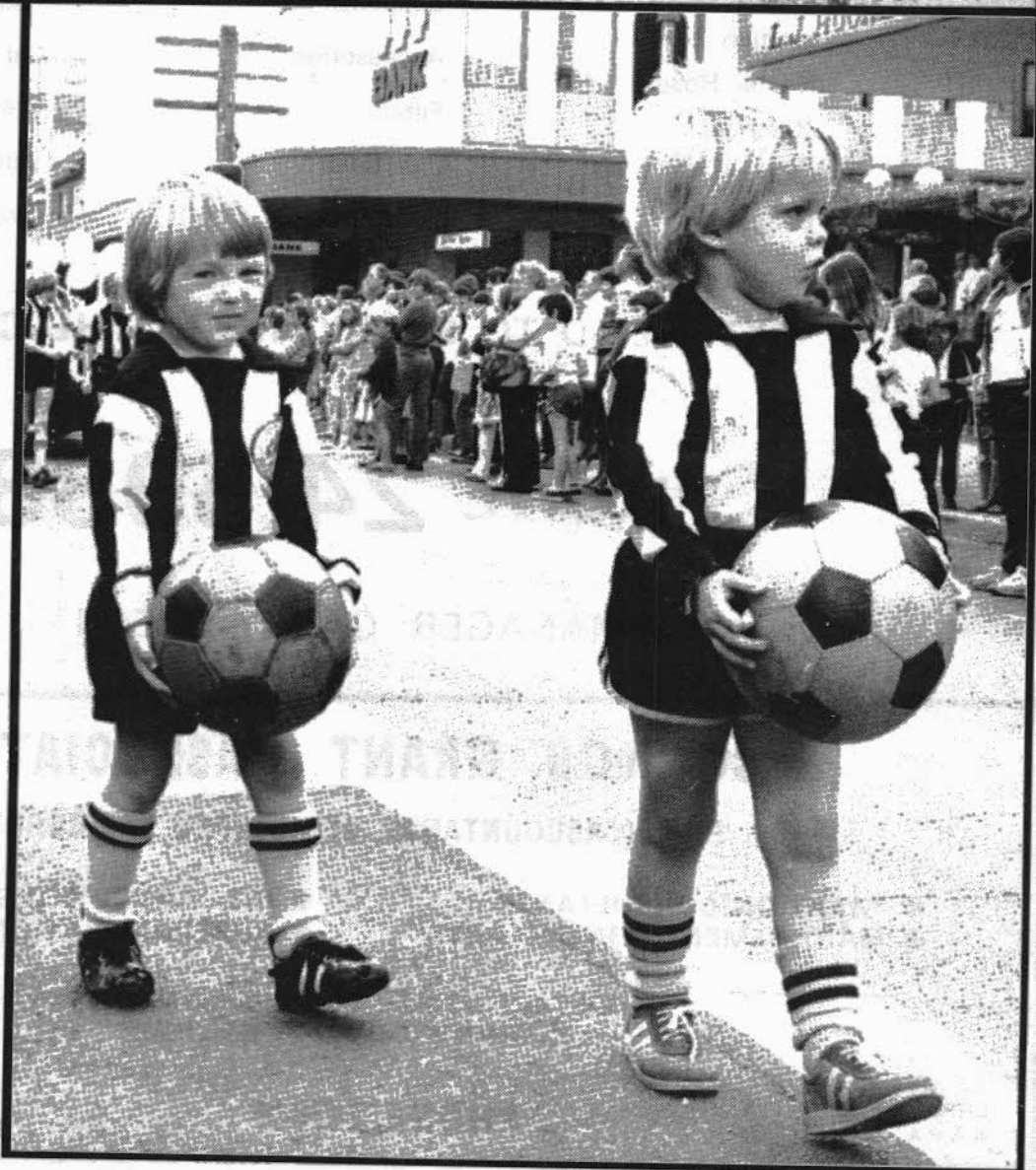

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Although this may seem to weaken our Club sides the Wyoming Soccer Club set a valuable precedent showing the way to other senior clubs towards promoting soccer of a higher standard that was previously available for our young "stars" to strive towards in their careers and I would hope that many more Wyoming juniors become future stars, perhaps not only in State League but when Philips League goes Divisionally in 1984.

The spirit of our senior teams is higher than ever before and having the new kiosk/meeting room for get togethers after training and following matches must go a long way in promoting Club spirit for junior and seniors alike. We hope all juniors and their parents follow the seniors as often as possible and are all welcome to join in the B-B-Q following each home game.

One matter that should be brought to parents and players attention is the Accident Scheme brought out by the Department of Sport and Recreation. This is for permanently disable or partially. YOU ARE NOT COVERED whilst training or practising unofficially or while travelling to and/or from training or matches. There is no cover for medical expenses or loss of wages if off work. (The Scheme's low premiums cannot be expected to cover these happenings). CLUB SECRETARY should be NOTIFIED IMMEDIATELY of all the circumstances.

As from the 1/10/81 it was compulsory for all persons to be covered by a Medical/Hospital Fund. Therefore our Club is not responsible for any Hosp/Medical bills incurred by players. Our Management Committee is empowered to deal with any cases which are known and proved to be exceptional circumstances provided that such cases be put before the Management Committee in writing. Any decision reached on these cases shall not create a precedent and shall be held in the strictest confidence by the committee. The scheme will not accept any responsibility for hospitalisation as full coverage can be obtained from a hospital fund.

Hope you all have an enjoyable soccer season for 1982.

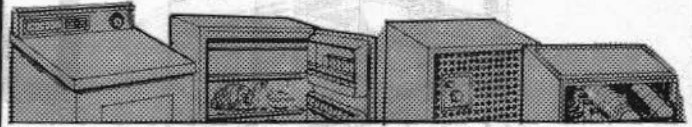

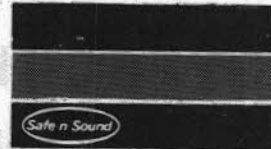

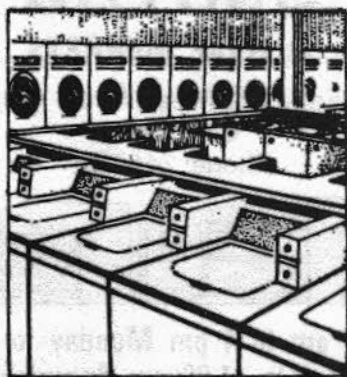
