TEAM REPORTS

Wyoming v Terrigal 8.5.82. The boys recorded their first loss of the season going down to Terrigal 1-0. TRAPPING AND BALL CONTROL 1. Wedge trap (sole of foot). 2. Inside of foot. 3. Outside of foot. 4. Top of foot (instep). 5. Calf trap (inside of leg.) 6. Shin trap (front of leg). 7. Thigh trap. 8. Stomach trap. 9. Chest trap. 10. Head trap.
