I read with interest an article in a recent soccer magazine and thought that I would like to share it with you.

"The teaching programmes for youngsters aged six to eight should encourage movement and skills through Soccer-related games such as chasings and other kids games.

The emphasis should be on FUN, with no competitive pressure for youngsters eight to 10 years, and should be aimed at increasing their feeling of the ball, experience of movement and to challenge their eagerness for learning.

The emphasis should now change to more enjoyment through better play using small-sided games such as two v two, three v three, five v five and seven v seven.

The purpose of using small-sided games is:

1. More time with coach.
2. More actual playing time.
3. Increased contact with the ball
4. Players required to make more decisions.
5. Players experience recurring situations more frequently.
6. More practical and realistic space to play in.
7. While learning more in both attack and defence, a player will become more complete and will understand more readily the roles of team-mates.
8. Total running distance is more than with larger field.
9. Most importantly, thanks to greater involvement, small-sided games are a lot of fun and more enjoyable for kids."

Don't forget the under 7 knockout on Sunday 15th August. Any help that you can give will be appreciated.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking the committee members and their spouses for the recent help given to the State League for the Philips Cup fixture at Grahame Park. I just don't know how we would have managed without them.

COACHING HINTS

WARM UP

The first 10 minutes of all training sessions is taken up with a warm-up. Before balls are kicked, players should run lightly over about 800 metres and then do a standard series of stretching exercises. This is followed by group warm-up drills that gradually build up pace and, towards the end involve the ball. A good warm-up is necessary before each game as a prevention to injury.

The object is to get players into a match as alert as possible, both physically and mentally.

The specific aim during warming-up, is to get blood circulating to all body muscles.

The performance of various exercises and running movements before a game assists the rate of breathing.

EXERCISES

Exercises should start slowly and increase in tempo, eg; walking, light running, acceleration, sharp turns, leaping off one foot or both feet. Remember always to start slowly and increase speed as the warm-up progresses.

GYMNASTICS

Gymnastics are introduced into general running work starting with the feet involving muscles in head, neck, arm chest shoulder, abdomen, thighs calf, legs and ankles.

EXERCISES WITH THE BALL

1. Following a period of gymnastic exercises, players are paired off with a ball. They then practise inter-passing, using alternate feet. After several minutes they should change to chipping the ball, rather than the ground pass.
2. This routine should be followed by volley kicking.
3. Next, have one player dribble the ball to his associate, take it behind him and return to his starting position, ending the movement with a pass.

GOALKEEPING WARM-UP

Their warm-up is exclusively gymnastic, the emphasis being on springing, bending and sharpening the reflexes.

Following light warming-up, he could do a few ground exercises such as front and back rolls, somersaults, hand-springs and dives.

After completing his exercises, the goalkeeper should enrol an assistant to throw a few balls to him.

OILS, LINIMENTS, MASSAGE

It is the application, not the mixture, which warms-up up a footballer.

Two ounces of wintergreen well-mixed with a small bottle of olive oil will last quite a long time and is not expensive. This and similar preparations can never take the place of a real warm-up.

COOL DOWN

Cooling down is just as important as warming up. Gradually decrease the tempo of training until body temperature and heart beat are near normal.

TEAM REPORTS
