## Registrar's Report 1982

With nearly 500 players this year and with a certain increase next year my job as registrar is to try and make registration as simple as possible for you, the coach, and myself. Our team nominations have to be submitted by the 28th Feb. to the CCSA Fixtures Officer to allow him to work out how many teams in each age group, fields and game times, and notify the Secretary's of each club with this information. You can help us by trying to registrar on these 2 Sundays - remember if you wait thinking we'll let the new ones register first - they only usually hear about it from the 'oldies' at school.

After you have registered, Peter and myself have to correlate Birth Certificates, photos, team sheets etc. and check each card off and mark what is still outstanding. We also list all boys registered on sheets in age groups for grading days and to give us an idea of how many teams we have. So if for example, we have 30 boys registered in U/10 we have to decide with the Committee if we nominate two teams (total 26 boys) or do we take a 'punt' and try for 3 teams. So please try and help us make the correct decisions by registering on these two Sundays.

I would like to introduce a Tuesday night 6.30-7.30pm after the initial 2 Sundays, where new players can register, and photos, birth certificates etc. can be brought. This will enable Peter and myself to then get registrations to the CCSA Registrar on the Wednesday, pick them up by the Thursday and get them to the coaches before the Saturday game. A minimum of about 10 minutes is need to register each player at the CCSA, as cards have to be gotten out of the files, photos checked, signatures checked off against team sheets and then cards stamped and team sheet stamped. What a lot of paper work and time spent!!

I hope this gives you some idea of the set up for registrations and that it will help you to see how vital it is that we have your co-operation in providing us with new photos etc. when you come to register initially.

TREASURER'S REPORT

REGISTRATION FEES FOR 1983

In 1983 the Club will face increases in all costs associated with the running of the Club, and the greatest increases will come from a levy of \$3.00 per head on every registration on the Central Coast, by the C.C.S.A. and a general increase in referee's fees to standardise their fees throughout Australia.

Below you will see a table which shows the costs that this Club will have to meet in 1983, and a break down of the cost per player for the year.

Considering the fee of \$22.00 over an average season of 20 rounds, the cost per week is \$1.10 and this compares most favourably against any other sport on the Central Coast. The registration fees for 1983 were decided upon at the Annual General Meeting on 20/9/82 and appear with last year's fees in the table below.

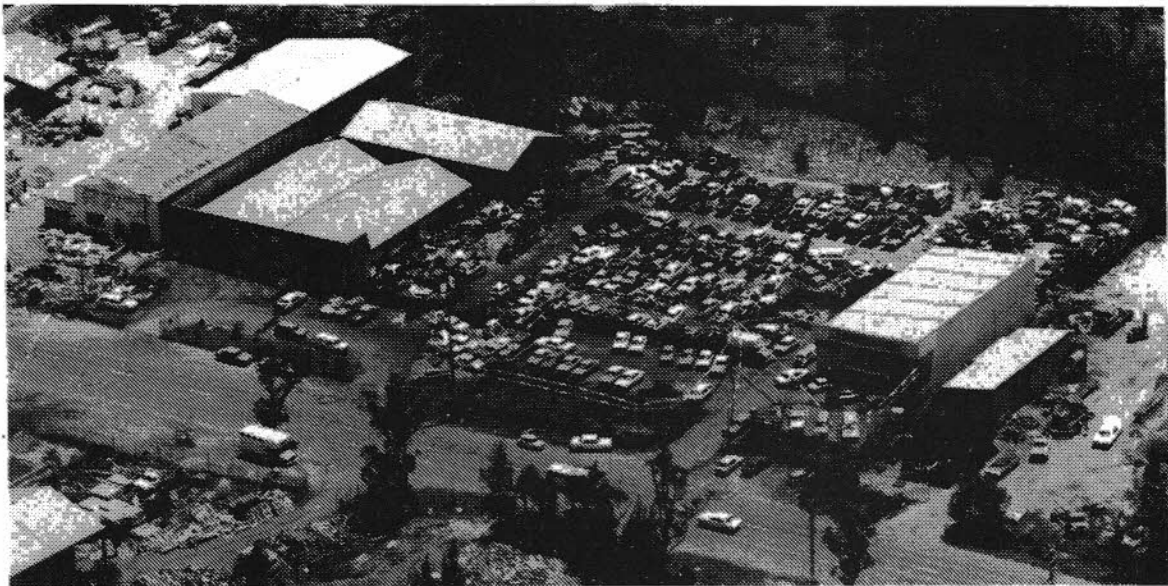
