### TIPS FOR KIDS, PARENTS & TEACHERS

The teaching programmes for youngsters aged six to eight should encourage movement and skills through Soccer-related games such as chasing and other kids games. The emphasis should be on FUN, with no competitive pressure for youngsters eight to 10 years, and should be aimed at increasing their feeling of the ball, experience of movement and to challenge their eagerness for learning. The emphasis should now change to more enjoyment through better play using small-sided games such as two v two, three v three, five v five and seven v seven.

The purpose of using small-sided games is:-

1. More time with the coach.
2. More actual playing time.
3. Increased contact with the ball.
4. Players required to make more decisions.
5. Players experience recurring situations more frequently.
6. More practical and realistic space to play in.
7. While learning more in both attack and defence, a player will become more complete and will understand more readily the roles of team-mates.
8. Total running distance is more than with larger field.
9. Most importantly, thanks to greater involvement, small-sided games are a lot of fun and more enjoyable for kids.

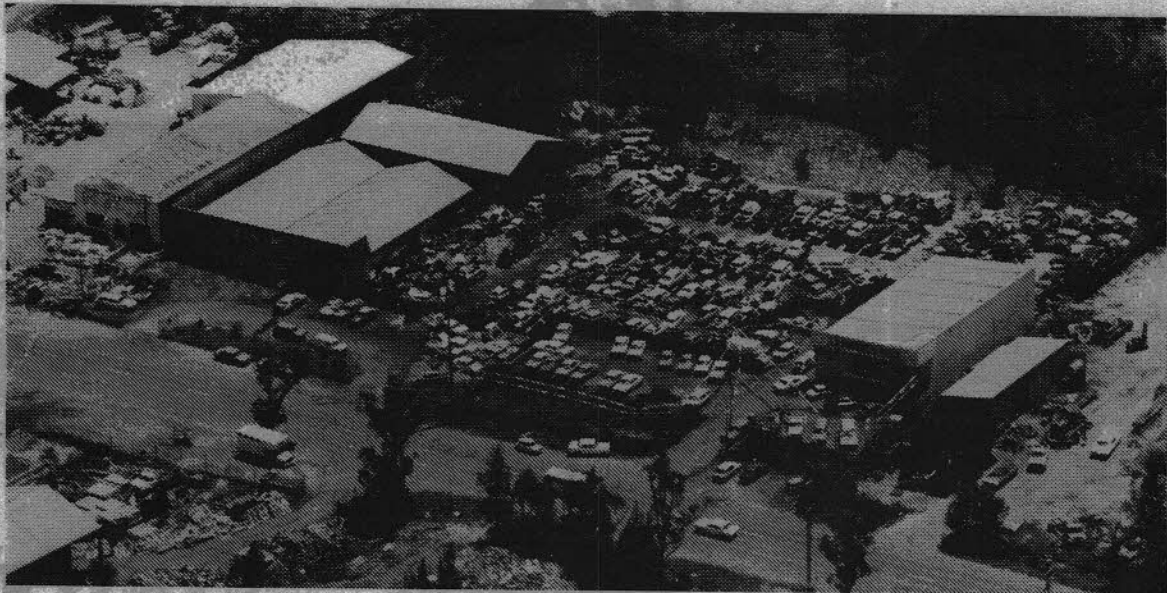

## PRESIDENT'S CORNER

### COMPETITION FORMAT FOR 1984.

The change of each Soccer Season usually means the change of the competition rules. It's about time the CCSA adopted a basic set of rules that could be followed easily, administered easily and accepted by all.

The first principle is to set the objects eg:

- 1) to eliminate any junior games being played on weekends incorporating Public Holidays or school Holidays.
- 2) to organise a game of soccer for every player every week for the whole season upto semi final time. - Juniors on Saturday Seniors on Sunday.
- 3) to eliminate the need of any team to play two games on a weekend.
- 4) to establish rules that wet weather or insufficient team nominations does not become a fixture officers nightmare.
- 5) to acknowledge the fact that we all want to foster soccer to allow the players to play as much soccer as possible.
- 6) to acknowledge the fact that you cannot please everyone!

The second principle is a plan to achieve the objects.

- 1) eliminate junior games being played on Easter, Anzac, June weekends and during May and August school holidays.
- 2) allow three weekends at the end of the season for semis, finals and Grand finals.
- 3) arrange fixtures for each team every week outside 1) & 2) (Bye games can be matched with a Bye in another age group if possible)
- 4) ignore two round system and introduce a system that caters for sufficient rounds (eg  $1\frac{1}{2}$  or  $2\frac{1}{4}$ ) to meet 3) above ie; every team in every age group will play the same amount of games each year.
- 5) washed out games will not be replayed - one out all out - each team will receive one point for a washed out game.
- 6) in the case of a bye the points allotted will be the maximum points gained by anyone team ie; if all teams have a draw the bye team will receive 1 point.
- 7) semi finals and finals  
if the game is drawn or washed out the higher team on the ladder progresses
- 8) Grand final  
- if drawn extra time is played then penalties  
- if washed out - joint premiers

There must be a winner on the day.

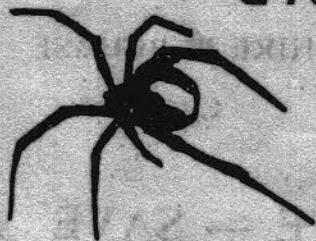
