PRESIDENT'S CORNER

SUGGESTED GRADING DAY GUIDELINES

1. Organise a 3 person committee other than the appointed coaches for the age group. The committee must have soccer experience and will have the final say.
2. Assemble the players.
3. Separate the players into
  - a) previously played
  - b) not previously played
    - a) (1) Separate into teams of 11 if possible governed by the standard previously played.
    - (11) Determine which players wish to be considered for a higher graded team - every endeavour should be made to encourage players to play up in grade.
    - (111) Attention should be made of last years 321 records
    - (1V) Play each team against the other noting players who should be considered to play up in grade.
    - (V) If a player desires to play up in grade the player should nominate the field position and should be given the opportunity to play in that position.
    - (VI) Once the 13 players for each team have been selected by the appointed coach it is the duty of the grading committee to ask all players whether they are happy with their team or whether they still wish to be considered to play up or down in grade. A decision will need to be made whether there are ground for further inspection of the player.
    - (VII) If satisfactory the 13 will be introduced to their coach or if no coach a selected coach on the day. The coach then
      - a) obtains players names and telephone numbers or addresses
      - b) give players his name and telephone on a paper and the next day and time for training.
  - b) Sort new players into separate groups according to ability to
    - KICK
    - HEAD
    - CATCH
    - SPRINT
    - RUN

Suggest allocation of 10 points if player is good at a particular skill. The higher points scored being the higher graded players.

Every opportunity shall be given to players showing ability to play up in grade.

The same procedure will be followed then as per a) (1V) above.
