PRESIDENT CORNER  
COACH/MANAGER INFORMATION

- 1) Junior washed out games will be allocated one point to each team and will not be replayed.
- 2) Bad language in all age groups must be discouraged.
- 3) The American shoot out system is being locked into to decide drawn Junior grand finals.
- 4) If a coach is using a player from a lower age group, the age group must be noted on the referee's card against the players name and the players' registration card must be in the coach's possession.
- 5) Player registration cards must be sighted by the opposition coach/manager before the start of play - a player cannot play without the registration card.
- 6) Jogging around the perimeters of the playing area is to be discouraged as it wears a path on the marked lines of the field which hinders council workers providing a proper marking.
- 7) Coaches/managers may be cited by the CCSA if they or their players are continually booked for breach of the rules.
- 8) Protests - the coach/manager asks the referee to write the word PROTEST on the the back of the referee's sheet and then signs the sheet - the manager/coach then advises in writing the club secretary who forwards written protest to CCSA with \$10 fee.
- 9) Referee fees must be paid before the game commences but do not have to be paid if the game does not commence e.g; due to bad weather.
- 10) Coach/manager must verify by signing the result of the game on the referees sheet.
- 11) Junior players sent from the field of play will be required to appear before the CCSA Judiciary. The player registration card must be handed to the referee after the game.
- 12) The eligibility for semi finals of senior players is determined by the last 4 games played. A player is eligible to play in semi finals if he has played a minimum of 5 full games for the club. If a player has played 5 games during the season in a higher division, he is classified as a player in that higher division and cannot play semi finals for a lower division unless the player plays the last 4 full games in the lower division.
- 13) Club referees in white will be paid normal referees fees if they hold a CCRA ward.
- 14) All player injuries must be reported to the secretary immediately.
- 15) 2 points will be awarded to a team on a bye - in the event of a washed out weekend the 'bye' team will receive 1 point.
- 16) Referees team sheets do not have to be signed by the player contrary to instructions on new referees sheets. The full name (first name and surname) must be PRINTED on the sheet by the coach/manager.
- 17) Manager/coaches are requested to mark their player registration cards with the teams grading eg; 8B1 or 10B2 etc.
- 18) Premier League 1st grade home team coaches are required to ring Judith Burgess 284748 between 6.30pm - 8.30pm on Sundays re match report to go into newspaper report.
- 19) Referees sheets must not be written in pencil or felt pens. BIROS only permitted

- 20) Senior games have been scheduled for earlier kick offs when the State League is playing at home.
- 21) Senior washed out games from 7/4/84 to be replayed on 13/5/84 - same time, same place.
- 22) 3-2-1 Points award is required on the weekly result sheet (provided). The coach/manager is required to allot three players with points 3,2,1 respectively. Game points will be tallied at the end of the competition games before the semi finals start. The player with the highest points is declared the 'Player of the Year' for that team.

**Coaches/managers should take into consideration when allotting points that the 3 points that the 3 points should be awarded to the player who is the most outstanding on the day. Things to look for are:-**

- player's performance with individual skills
- player attitude during game
- positional play on field
- technique
- sportsmanship
- team support
- adherence to pre match tactics.

2 points should be allotted to the next most outstanding player and 1 point to the next.

RED CARD - Violent conduct, serious foul play, foul and/or abusive language a one match automatic suspension (minimum).

YELLOW CARD - penalty points are incurred by players for a variety of misdemeanours and use of the yellow card are divided into two groups:

- (1) The more serious offences - to be issued with a yellow card caution instantly,
- (2) The offence in which the offender receives a warning, then repeats the offence; is given a yellow card caution.

All time wasting .....	2 points
* Ungentlemanly conduct .....	2 points
** Dissent .....	1 point

\* Ungentlemanly Conduct is any other offence not included above so judge by the referee to be ungentlemanly.

\*\* Dissent - showing dissent includes: (1) interference by other player when the referee is speaking to player(s) after an offence.  
(2) Continued commenting to the Referee concerning his decisions in an effort to intimidate him.
