## REGISTRARS RAMBLINGS

Well, the season has started even if only one or two games have been played, and hopefully all teams are organised and have enough boys to fill their teams. If you are still short a player, please ask the boys in your team (and in non-comp.) girls if they know anyone who would still like to register.

I think Garry Buchanan has now recovered from the shock of finding out that the little U/6 'boy' who wore pink shorts to training is really a girl. She made it into the 'A' team on her own merits with everyone thinking she was a boy - so take heart girls!!, and welcome to Shannon O'Reilly who is only the second girl to play in the lower age groups - Jackie Astolfi was our first many years ago. Hope your sides have stopped hurting Mrs. B - she couldn't stop laughing for about an hour after seeing Garry's face when he found out.

I would like to remind all coaches, managers and parents that the object of non-competition teams is to teach them to play soccer and allow them to enjoy it without any pressure to win. If children are put under pressure at this young age they will lose interest when they get to about 11 or 12. So before any of you start to yell abuse for a missed goal etc. stop and think - could you have scored it or done any better when you were their age, or could you in fact do any better now?? Sport should be fun for the young.

Any parent who has not received back their child's birth certificate, please check with your coach or manager.

Just a couple of reminders for those coaches/managers who were not at last monthly meeting -

Please do not use pencils or felt pens on referee sheets. If they get damp or wet they become illegible and the CCSA will issue a large fine to the club.

Christian names must be written in full for all ages. Old referee sheets are used for the non-comp. teams and the new larger blue printed forms for U/10 upwards, and names on these must be printed in full by coach/manager and then signed by the players.

Any boy (or man) (or girl) - start again - Any player who is heard to swear on the field of play by a referee whether in black and white, or unofficially appointed will be sent from the field and will have to appear before the Judiciary Committee. In non-comp. ages they will be asked to attend with their parents and coach. It is a pretty traumatic event and to prevent this would any coach/manager hearing any player swearing at training please discipline them instantly and explain that if they are sent off they may not play for anything up to 6 weeks. Non-comp. coaches are also asked to enforce this (even if you don't think 6-9 year olds swear), it won't hurt to tell your players what can happen.

If any coach or manager did not get a sheet with their cards giving you the basic competition rules and information and would like a copy would you please give me a ring. The main rule to remember is the one regarding players playing for other teams, so I will put this one in here for your information.

- a) A boy registered in his age group can only play for his team i.e. 9A cannot play 9B.
- b) A boy may play in a higher age group - his own grading plus one below i.e. 9A can play 10A and 10B, he cannot play 10C. He can however play in any U/11 grade.
- c) Any boy filling in in another team, must have his card at the game. An U/9 can play up in the competition teams using his non-comp. card. His grade must be shown on the Referee's sheet i.e. John Smith 9B1.
- d) No player is to be borrowed from a lower age group and used in preference to an already established team member, unless to qualify for semi-finals if you are going to be short. A player playing up in grade must play 2 competition games to be qualified for semifinals.

My special thanks to Steve Hogg for providing copies of the U/9 1984 teams. This saved a great deal of time in having the U/10 age group registered this year and I am sure the parents and I appreciated his gesture.

I would like to wish you all Good Luck for the season, but most of all Good Sportsmanship.
