KNOW YOUR RULES

This is a new section in the Thorn Tales, and is designed to find out how much you really know about the rules of soccer.

You and I both know that we ALL (especially we on the side line) think we could do a better job than the referee - - so here is the first installment of a quiz to see how good you are. Keep a record of your scores. We may even give a prize at the end of the season - maybe a special black and white uniform!

Below are 10 questions. The answers will be pinned to a notice board at the club house the week after this magazine is issued (just to give you plenty of time to think about it). If there is enough feedback about 'Know your Rules', we may even run it as a competition each month.

So - - pencils ready - -

1. How much of the ball should be over the goal line for the ball to be out of play?
2. When kicking off, the player mis-kicks the ball and only moves a few inches. The same player immediately kicks it again. What should you do?
3. A player takes a corner kick which hits the goal post and rebounds towards the kicker, who then kicks it again and net the ball. What is your decision.
4. Can a goalkeeper take part in the game on his opponent's half of the field?
5. Can the goalkeeper take a throw-in?
6. Would the following five questions count as goals?
 - (a) Straight into the net from a corner kick
 - (b) Straight into the net from the kick off
 - (c) Straight into the net from a free kick for off side
 - (d) A throw in which the goalkeeper fields but allows to bounce from his hands.
 - (e) A shot which hits the referee and is deflected past the goalkeeper into the net.
7. Can a player be off-side from a goal kick?
8. You discover a halftime that you accidentally cut short the first half by 5 minutes. How long should the second half be?
9. From a throw-in, the ball dribbles past attackers, defenders and even the goalkeeper, and goes into the net without being touched. What do you award?
10. A team kicks off, and, by combined play, scores a goal without the other team touching the ball. Do you award the goal?
