Finals: 14th September, 1991

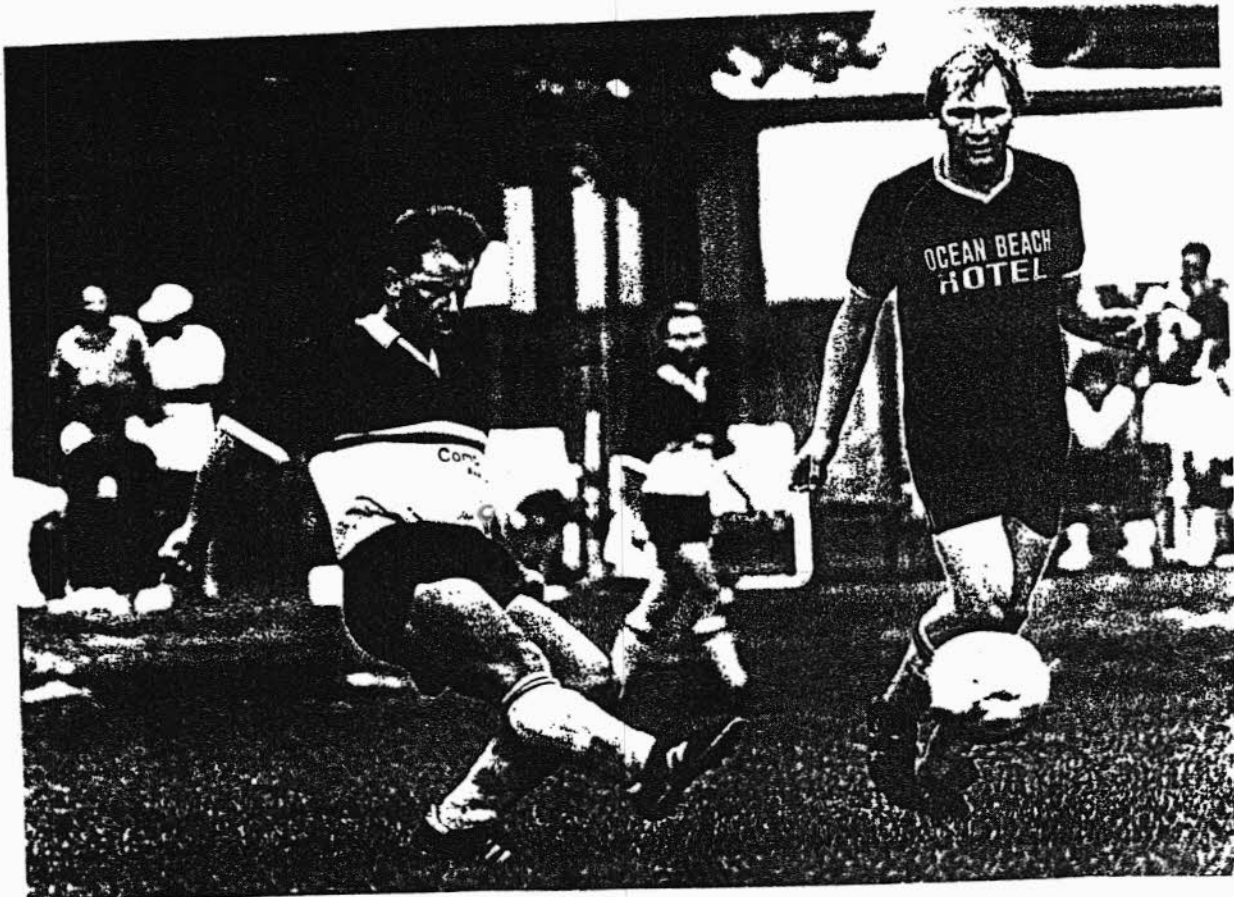
Grand Finals: 21st September, 1991

PLAYER PROFILE



JARROD MOBBERLEY

First grade's "enforcer" Jarrod Mobberley, is one of a select few Wyoming players to have made the transition all the way from Under 6s all the way through to the First Grade Premier League team. Still only 19, Jarrod is already one of the veterans of the first grade team, 1991 being his third season in the top grade.

Jarrold has been with Wyoming throughout his entire soccer career, starting out in 1978 as a member of Warren Anderson's outstanding Under 6A team. After a couple of seasons off he returned in 1981 as a member of Bob O'Toole's premierships- winning Under 9C team, where he won the Player of the Year award. More premierships followed in 1983 (Under 11Bs) and 1986 (Under 14As) before he made his senior debut in 1988, at the tender age of 15.

Arguably the fittest player in the Club, Jarrod has been a fine basketballer, surf lifesaver and swimmer in his younger days, winning a silver medal at the Australian age swimming championships in 1987. He is an ex-student of Valley View Public School and Lisarow High. Jarrod is currently studying Industrial Technology at Sydney University and plans on a career as a high school teacher on graduating.

HINTS TO COACHES AND MANAGERS**Part 23 Player Identification and Recognition**

It is most important for a coach to be able to categorise his players. Knowing what 'types' he has in his squad, he will be able to tailor his coaching techniques to get the best out of each individual.

For ease of identification, we will list a range of main types, many of which can be found in most club teams.

Phrase	Meaning
A solid player	<i>A very slow defender</i>
Fast	<i>Has absolutely no ability to control the ball</i>
Tackles hard	<i>Goes around kicking people</i>
Experienced	<i>Knows how to kick people and hide it from the referee</i>
Promising	<i>Unlikely to ever make a good player</i>
Very promising	<i>See above, but has a parent on the committee</i>
Good in the Air	<i>Unable to control the ball on the ground. Usually very tall so he doesn't have to jump to head the ball</i>
Works hard off the ball	<i>Runs around like a headless chook, but quite unable to do anything when he receives a pass</i>
A coach's player	<i>No-one knows how he gets a place in the team every week</i>
A player's player	<i>The one who always buys the drinks</i>
Brilliant	<i>About average</i>
Super star	<i>Slightly better than average, but paid a lot more</i>
Plays like Maradona	<i>Capable of scoring goals with his hands</i>
Utility player	<i>Not good enough to get a game in any position</i>
Loyal clubman	<i>No other club wants him</i>
Top coach	<i>A coach who is about to be sacked</i>
Fearless keeper	<i>Often saves the ball with his head, because it is harder than other people's boots</i>
A safe pair of hands	<i>Catches a dry ball at least once in three attempts when not being challenged</i>
Reliable	<i>Needs to be led around the paddock, but will stay in the same spot once you put him there</i>
Has a lethal shot	<i>Watch out if you are a spectator anywhere behind the goals</i>
Has played top soccer overseas	<i>Made one appearance for a pub team in Liverpool</i>
Comes to Australia highly recommended	<i>His European club has been trying to get rid of him for years</i>

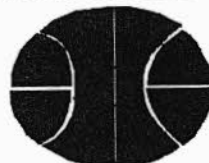



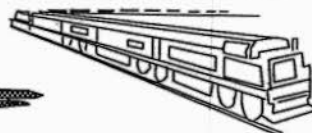
