SUBSTITUTES..

It is official , Under 10 teams can draw from any Under 9 player. Thus a 9A player can play in the 10F team. The rule stipulates "the player must be able to handle the higher level".

A junior player to qualify to play Semi's for a higher grade team must take the field twice for the higher team during the season. The player must also play at least 5 times for the Club in his own team during the season. This is the minimum qualification. It does not matter how many games he plays for the higher grade or how many different teams he qualifies for. This simplified means Abdiqani from the 14C could play 10 games for the 16A and 10 for the 16C. The only trouble would be to play on 2 fields at the same time come semi finals. If the 14C are upgraded to the 14A then Abdiqani or any other 14A player could no longer play for the 16C's.
