JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

This year Stephen Bech is junior player of the year.

LADIES REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

In 1995 Wyoming fielded two teams for Ladies soccer. Our Under 16 side played A division and the Senior side played B division. For those in the club who don't know, Ladies soccer is played on Sunday at Fagans Park, Point Clare.

Last year the club had only two junior sides. Faced with the fact that some of these would be moving to Seniors in 1995, we arranged for a squad of the older girls to play in a seniors 7-a-side tournament at Charlestown.
