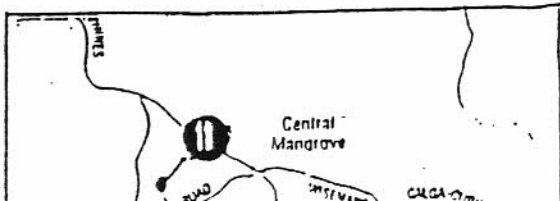
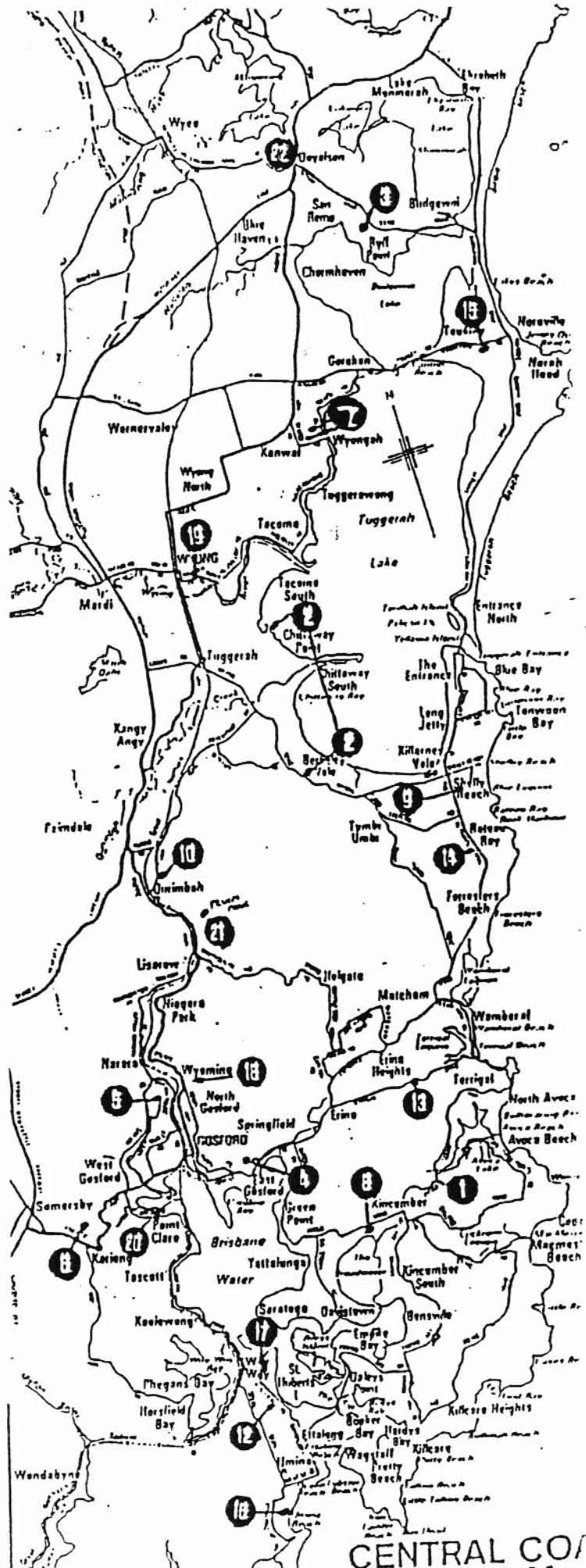
Wyoming's current first grade captain and goalkeeper, Jarrod is in his 18th season with the club having first played in the U6A team of 1978. After missing two seasons he returned in 1981, winning the Player of the Year award in the U9C1 team coached by current Premier League coach, Bob O'Toole. The nucleus of this team, which included a number of other current senior players (Luke O'Toole, Greg Preston and Anthony Vos) stayed together through the remainder of their junior years winning premierships in 1983 (U11B) and 1986 (U14A). In his latter years as a junior he gave away goalkeeping and moved into the on-field defensive line where he shone to such an extent, that in 1988 at the age of only 16, he moved into the senior ranks and was quickly promoted to first grade where he has now played in excess of 200 matches. Sadly Jarrod lost his father, John, a great supporter of the club who was killed in an accident in 1992 - Wyoming's major playing trophy, the Senior Player of the Year, is now named in his honour.
