Apr 26: Wyoming 1 Wyong 1

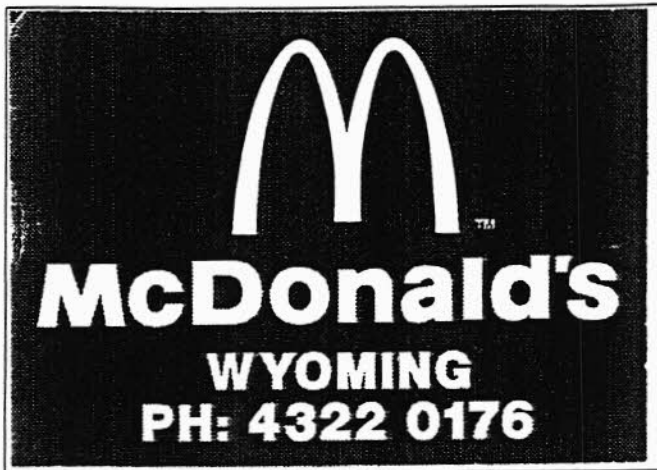
