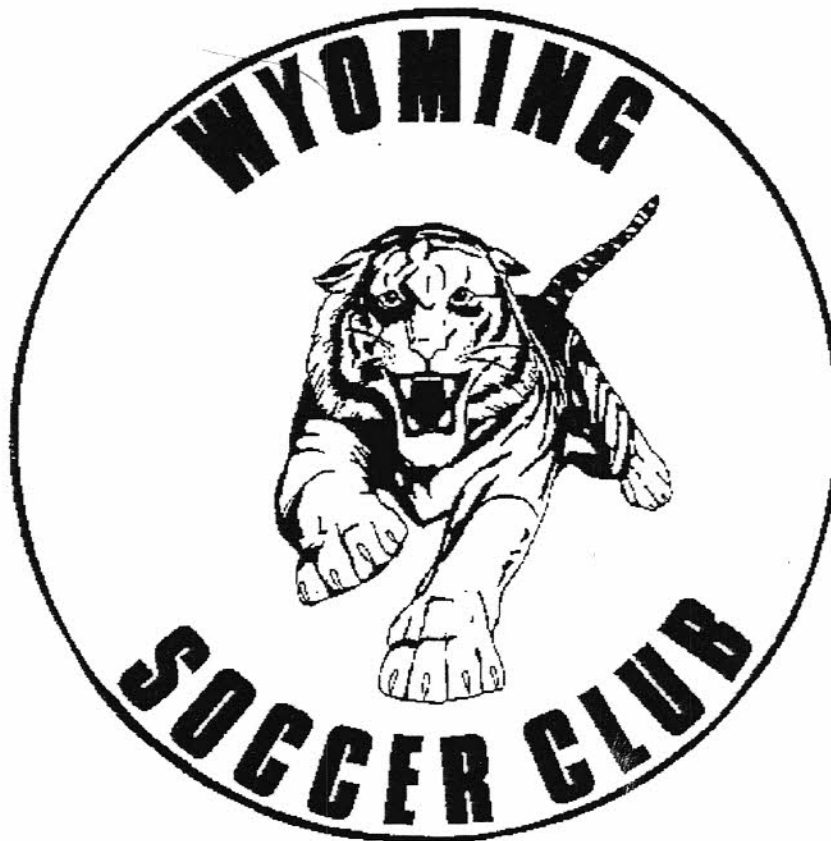

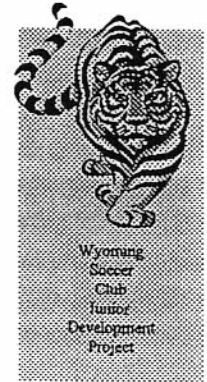

# Improving the standard of soccer



**MASTER  
SOCCER**



This year the Club commenced an improvement program for junior players. The Club approved the introduction of Master Soccer. The aim of the program is to standardise the coaching of players in the age groups 5 to 9 throughout the Club.

## **WHAT IS 'MASTER SOCCER'**

*MASTER SOCCER provides for a structured training program over a 5 year period. There are 18 skill exercises. The skills selected have been pruned from over 50 exercises. All exercises have been designed for simplicity and can be practised at home. A player can start the program at any age. The longer a player has been involved in the Program the better the results. The main principle, behind all skills, is to achieve the highest target possible by the end of the soccer season. The target must be achieved in successive repetitions or, by a time to beat based on an average of 3 successive attempts. If the sequence is broken the player must start again. Some skills will be more difficult than others but the aim is to master them all by practice, practice, practice. Coaches should err on the side of perfection with regard to the performance of each skill. There will undoubtedly be a need for the junior coach, to seek technical developmental advice from the supervisor coach on certain skills with which a particular player has*

*difficulty. Upon the successful completion of the Program the player will possess good basic skills that can be worked on by future coaches. The player will possess skills in: ball control, heading, passing, striking, receiving, kicking with both feet, eye/foot co-ordination, sprinting, backwards running, turning, feinting, juggling, dribbling, goalkeeping.*

### **RATIONALE**

The development of the player can be supplemented by a more structured coaching program at an early age. Numerous children drop out of soccer because they are not coached in all the basic skills of the game and therefore find the game hard to play. Numerous players at an older age, do not possess a full range of basic skills because of the neglect to develop good habits in their early years. If good habits can be established early, it goes without saying the child will be a better player in his/her future years.

MASTER SOCCER will provide coaches with a structured program as a supplement to a normal training session. It can be incorporated into a part of each session.

MASTER SOCCER is designed with the emphasis on simplicity with a minimal amount of equipment on a small area of ground. It provides the parents with various tasks, which can be practiced, at leisure, in the backyard or the nearest park with their child. It is emphasised that, if possible, the skills should be demonstrated by a qualified coach. The exercises can be practised all year round.

MASTER SOCCER will provide a standard approach to the coaching of players through those important early years. It can be used by the Club for next year's grading and team selection as it will identify the better players.
