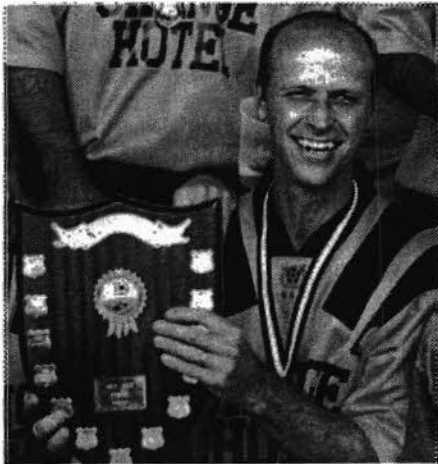




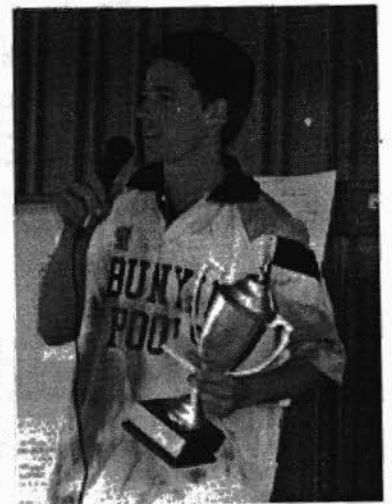

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Apart from producing many outstanding soccer players over the years, the Wyoming Soccer Club has a number of ex-junior players who have made their mark in other sports. For example:

ANDREW SAINSBURY who played for Wyoming from 1981 to 1985, played four matches for the NSW Sheffield Shield cricket team during the 1998/99 season and is again in the State squad this year. Andrew is the current captain of the Northern District team in the Sydney grade competition.

JOHN CARLAW, a member of the 1999 Balmain first grade rugby league team and previously a first grader with Newcastle and Melbourne, played soccer for our club in 1985.

MATT MILLER played for the club in 1980 and 1981 before taking up rugby union. He has been a permanent first grader with the Eastwood club for many years and was a member of the team which took out the 1999 Sydney premiership. He has also represented NSW and been an Australian Sevens player since 1997.

PETER MILLER played soccer for Wyoming for seven seasons between 1983 and 1989, before following in his older brother, Matt's footsteps. Peter was the Eastwood first grade full back this season and the leading try scorer in the Sydney competition, scoring a crucial try in the grand final. Peter also played for the Emerging Waratahs this season and has been approached to play for Queensland in next season's Super 12 competition.

ROBERT MILLER, the youngest of the three Miller brothers also played junior soccer for our club (1986 and 1989). He has played for the Australian U/19 rugby team and this season captained the Eastwood first grade colts team.

ANDREW MOSELEY captained the Gosford first grade team to victory in this season's Central Coast premiership. An outstanding cricket wicketkeeper he played for NSW Country Colts in the 1998/99 season. Andrew played soccer for Wyoming in 1986 and 1987.

DAVID MARYSKA, kicked a last minute penalty goal to give Woy Woy the 1999 Central Coast first grade premiership. He played nine seasons of soccer for Wyoming between 1980 and 1989.
