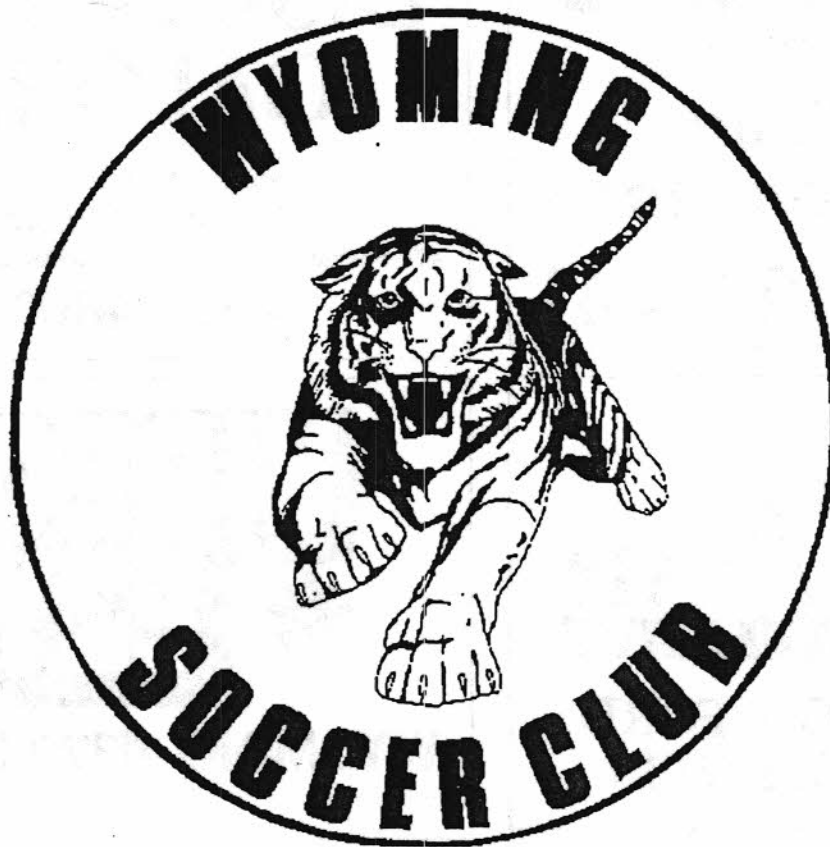

CANTEEN REPORT

The position of Canteen manager, as with all the positions on the committee are filled by volunteers. Unlike other positions the canteen needs your help to be able to stay open all day. As we are parents like yourselves and have children whose competition games we want to attend, teams are rostered to help between 9-00am and 3-30pm. You will only be required on roster for a period of approximately two hours throughout the entire season. Your manager will tell you when you are rostered. When working in the canteen you will be supervised and only have to do counter serving.

Without your help the canteen will be forced to close for periods of time and sales lost. The Canteen profits are important to the Club and are used to the benefit of the players.


Unfortunately during the 1999 season we repeatedly notified managers that their teams were required for canteen duty and we were constantly disappointed by the lack of response by teams who did not show up. This left the canteen short staffed and we were forced to then call on a small number of willing teams and individuals who gave more than their fair share of assistance.

As we advised in our last report we may be required to look more closely at teams constantly ignoring requests for help. Unfortunately this is now the case and we have a list of some six teams refusing to co-operate (five non-competition and one competition) and we are only four weeks into the season. This is now putting undue pressure on teams who have already, willingly done their duty. If there are no parents in your team available for that particular time slot it's your responsibility to swap with another team. So please come in and see us as your help will be greatly appreciated by us, the players, other teams and the Club.


We would like pass on our appreciation to the committee members who helped us out throughout the four days of grading days and trial matches. A special thank you to Sue Neild, Sue Lythgoe, Linda Bendelch, Jenny Wallington and Kerry Sullivan for their assistance in offering to help or serving in the canteen.
