AN OPEN LETTER TO ALL CLUB MEMBERS AND WYOMING RESIDENTS

Your Committee is putting in a lot of effort to persuade Gosford City Council to improve grounds and buildings and to address problems associated with criminal behaviour at Alan Davidson Park.

You might have seen in the Express that a safety audit was conducted at the Park on Friday night of June 29 through to the wee hours of Saturday morning. This was mainly to identify solutions to anti-social problems and was required before either the Police or Council would look seriously at overall changes to the Park. The changes identified in the audit will be aimed at reducing this particular problem but it also provides the Club an opportunity to agitate for better facilities and long overdue ground improvements.

We think the plan on the following page provides the framework for a nicer, more usable and user-friendly Park. There is an obvious advantage to the Club from improved and enlarged training and playing areas. Criminal behaviour will be controlled by opening the area up and reducing opportunities for concealment. Security is improved by the relocation of the playground close to the centre of activity. Additional lighting is proposed. The introduction of a cycleway and perhaps a half basketball court will bring new users to the Park making it the more difficult to carry on criminal behaviour.

To implement the plan will obviously require a substantial amount of money. The Committee has been working closely with Councillor Daniel Cook in an effort to attract funding which is currently available from Council. Due in large part to the efforts of Councillor Cook and I understand Councillor Craig Doyle it appears certain that a minimum amount of \$200,000 will be allocated for upgrading the Park. If you have the opportunity, please let both men know that their efforts are appreciated.

You can help now by considering the proposed plan and letting me know of any other ideas which you believe could benefit the Park for soccer or just for general community use. The Club is represented on the Steering Committee for the upgrading of the Park and so your ideas can be presented directly to the Committee for its consideration.

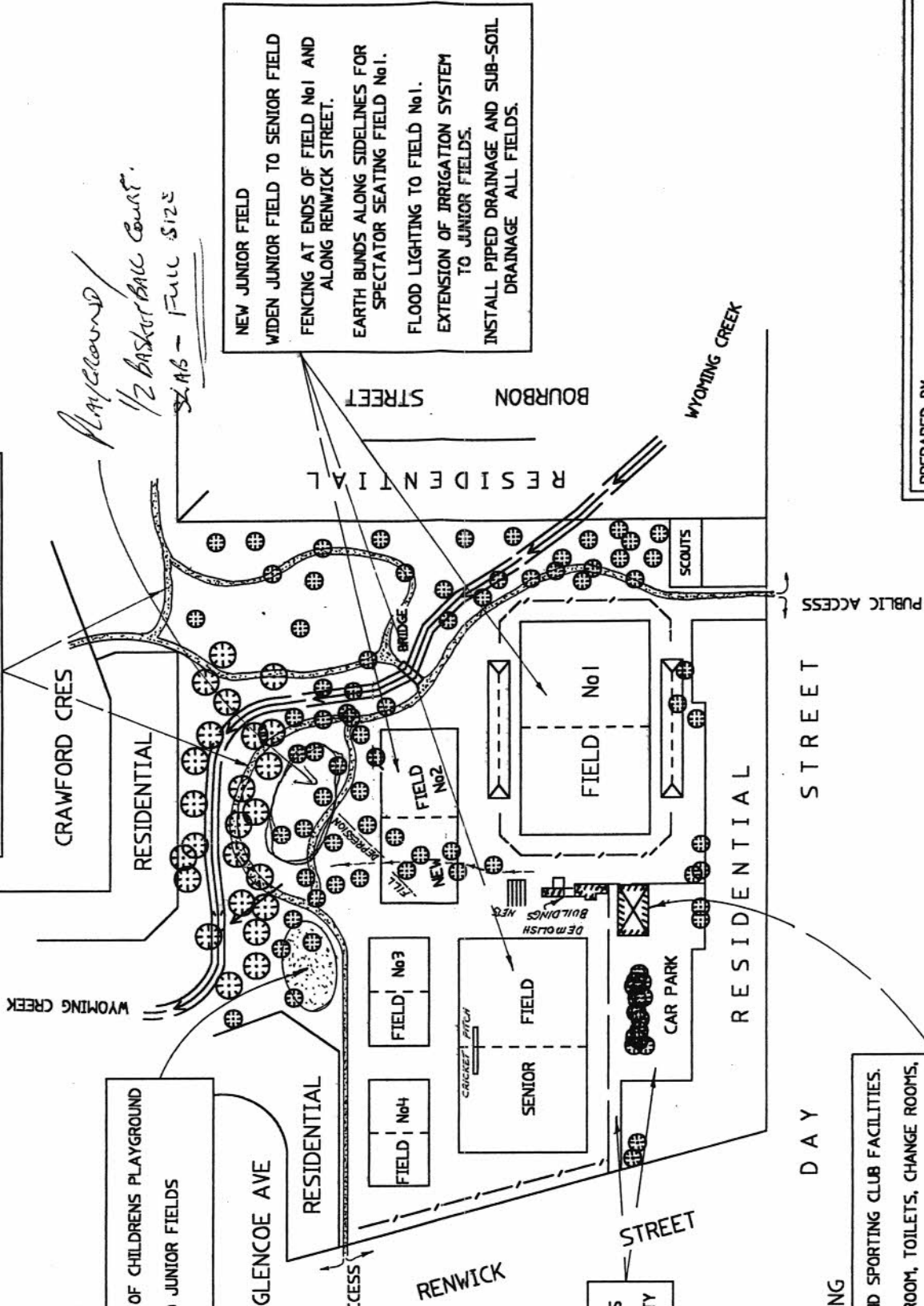

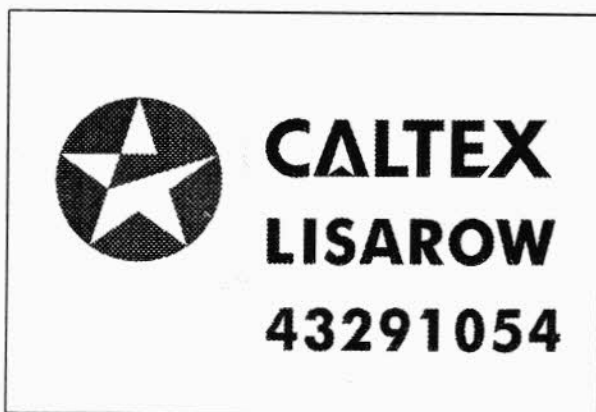
