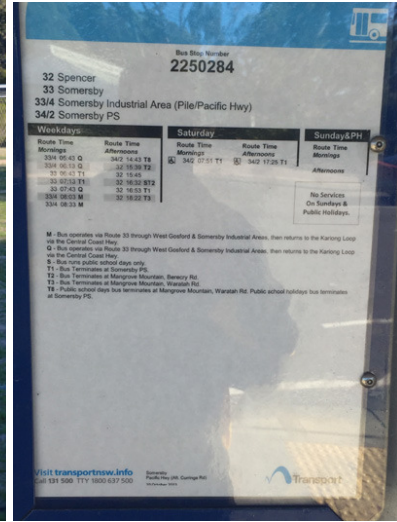
### DRAWN OUT

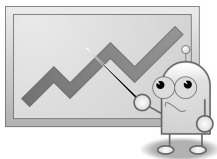
